Foreword:

What is contained within these pages is a translation of the Bible: it is all 150 Psalms in the King James Version but with the male pronouns replaced with "they."

There are many other Bible translations which lean toward gender neutrality, but to date this author has not encountered any that go so far as to change God's pronouns. Or in other words, we can have our "gender equality," just so long as God remains male.

But, of course, God ISN'T male.

God lives in YOU. Why shouldn't you use YOUR pronouns?

This book may be used alongside a prayer book or spell book, such as Anna Riva's *The Power of the Psalms* or Godfrey Selig's *Secrets of the Psalms*. These are only two, but there are many, many others (click here for a list). 



- 1. Blessed is the person that walketh not in the counsel of the ungodly, nor standeth in the way of sinners, nor sitteth in the seat of the scornful.
- 2. But their delight is in the law of the Lord; and in their law do they meditate day and night.
- 3. And they shall be like a tree planted by the rivers of water, that bringeth forth their fruit in their season; their leaf also shall not wither; and whatsoever they do shall prosper.
- 4. The ungodly are not so: but are like the chaff which the wind driveth away.
- 5. Therefore the ungodly shall not stand in the judgment, nor sinners in the congregation of the righteous.
- 6. For the Lord knoweth the way of the righteous: but the way of the ungodly shall perish.



Psalm 2


- 1. Why do the heathen rage, and the people imagine a vain thing?
- 2. The monarchs of the earth set themselves, and the rulers take counsel together, against the Lord, and against Their anointed, saying,
- 3. "Let us break their bands asunder, and cast away their cords from us."
- 4. They that sit in the heavens shall laugh: the Lord shall have them in derision.
- 5. Then shall They speak unto them in Their wrath, and vex them in Their sore displeasure:
- 6. "Yet have I set my ruler upon my holy hill of Zion."
- 7. I will declare the decree: the Lord hath said unto me, "Thou art my child; this day have I begotten thee.
- **8.** Ask of me, and I shall give thee the heathen for thine inheritance, and the uttermost parts of the earth for thy possession.
- 9. Thou shalt break them with a rod of iron; thou shalt dash them in pieces like a potter's vessel."
- 10. Be wise now therefore, O ye monarchs: be instructed, ye judges of the earth.
- 11. Serve the Lord with fear, and rejoice with trembling.
- 12. Kiss the child, lest They be angry, and ye perish from the way, when Their wrath is kindled but a little. Blessed are all they that put their trust in Them.



Psalm 3

1. Lord, how are they increased that trouble me! many are they that rise up against me.

- 2. Many there be which say of my soul, "There is no help for them in God." Selah.
- 3. But thou, O Lord, art a shield for me; my glory, and the lifter up of mine head.
- 4. I cried unto the Lord with my voice, and They heard me out of Their holy hill. Selah.
- 5. I laid me down and slept; I awaked; for the Lord sustained me.
- 6. I will not be afraid of ten thousands of people, that have set themselves against me round about.
- 7. Arise, O Lord; save me, O my God: for thou hast smitten all mine enemies upon the cheek bone; thou hast broken the teeth of the ungodly.
- 8. Salvation belongeth unto the Lord: thy blessing is upon thy people. Selah.




- 1. Hear me when I call, O God of my righteousness: thou hast enlarged me when I was in distress; have mercy upon me, and hear my prayer.
- 2. O ye children, how long will ye turn my glory into shame? how long will ye love vanity, and seek after leasing? Selah.
- 3. But know that the Lord hath set apart for Themself they that are godly: the Lord will hear when I call unto Them.
- 4. Stand in awe, and sin not: commune with your own heart upon your bed, and be still. Selah.
- 5. Offer the sacrifices of righteousness, and put your trust in the Lord.
- 6. There be many that say, Who will shew us any good? Lord, lift thou up the light of thy countenance upon us.
- 7. Thou hast put gladness in my heart, more than in the time that their corn and their wine increased.
- 8. I will both lay me down in peace, and sleep: for thou, Lord, only makest me dwell in safety.



- 1. Give ear to my words, O Lord, consider my meditation.
- 2. Hearken unto the voice of my cry, my Ruler, and my God: for unto thee will I pray.
- 3. My voice shalt thou hear in the morning, O Lord; in the morning will I direct my prayer unto thee, and will look up.
- 4. For thou art not a God that hath pleasure in wickedness: neither shall evil dwell with thee.
- 5. The foolish shall not stand in thy sight: thou hatest all workers of iniquity.

- 6. Thou shalt destroy them that speak leasing: the Lord will abhor the bloodthirsty and deceitful.
- 7. But as for me, I will come into thy house in the multitude of thy mercy: and in thy fear will I worship toward thy holy temple.
- 8. Lead me, O Lord, in thy righteousness because of mine enemies; make thy way straight before my face.
- 9. For there is no faithfulness in their mouth; their inward part is very wickedness; their throat is an open sepulchre; they flatter with their tongue.
- 10. Destroy thou them, O God; let them fall by their own counsels; cast them out in the multitude of their transgressions; for they have rebelled against thee.
- 11. But let all those that put their trust in thee rejoice: let them ever shout for joy, because thou defendest them: let them also that love thy name be joyful in thee.
- 12. For thou, Lord, wilt bless the righteous; with favour wilt thou compass them as with a shield.




- 1. O Lord, rebuke me not in thine anger, neither chasten me in thy hot displeasure.
- 2. Have mercy upon me, O Lord; for I am weak: O Lord, heal me; for my bones are vexed.
- 3. My soul is also sore vexed: but thou, O Lord, how long?
- 4. Return, O Lord, deliver my soul: oh save me for thy mercies' sake.
- 5. For in death there is no remembrance of thee: in the grave who shall give thee thanks?
- 6. I am weary with my groaning; all the night make I my bed to swim; I water my couch with my tears.
- 7. Mine eye is consumed because of grief; it waxeth old because of all mine enemies.
- 8. Depart from me, all ye workers of iniquity; for the Lord hath heard the voice of my weeping.
- 9. The Lord hath heard my supplication; the Lord will receive my prayer.
- 10. Let all mine enemies be ashamed and sore vexed: let them return and be ashamed suddenly.



- 1. O Lord my God, in thee do I put my trust: save me from all them that persecute me, and deliver me:
- 2. Lest they tear my soul like a lion, rending it in pieces, while there is none to deliver.
- 3. O Lord my God, If I have done this; if there be iniquity in my hands;
- 4. If I have rewarded evil unto them that were at peace with me; (yea, I have delivered them that without cause are mine enemy:)

- 5. Let the enemy persecute my soul, and take it; yea, let them tread down my life upon the earth, and lay mine honour in the dust. Selah.
- 6. Arise, O Lord, in thine anger, lift up thyself because of the rage of mine enemies: and awake for me to the judgment that thou hast commanded.
- 7. So shall the congregation of the people compass thee about: for their sakes therefore return thou on high.
- **8.** The Lord shall judge the people: judge me, O Lord, according to my righteousness, and according to mine integrity that is in me.
- 9. Oh let the wickedness of the wicked come to an end; but establish the just: for the righteous God trieth the hearts and reins.
- **10.** My defence is of God, which saveth the upright in heart.
- 11. God judgeth the righteous, and God is angry with the wicked every day.
- 12. If they turn not, They will whet Their sword; They have bent Their bow, and made it ready.
- 13. They have also prepared for them the instruments of death; They ordain Their arrows against the persecutors.
- 14. Behold, they travail with iniquity, and hath conceived mischief, and brought forth falsehood.
- 15. They made a pit, and digged it, and is fallen into the ditch which they made.
- 16. Their mischief shall return upon their own head, and their violent dealing shall come down upon their own pate.
- 17. I will praise the Lord according to Their righteousness: and will sing praise to the name of the Lord most high.



- 1. O Lord, our Lord, how excellent is thy name in all the earth! who hast set thy glory above the heavens.
- 2. Out of the mouth of babes and sucklings hast thou ordained strength because of thine enemies, that thou mightest still the enemy and the avenger.
- 3. When I consider thy heavens, the work of thy fingers, the moon and the stars, which thou hast ordained;
- 4. What is humanity, that thou art mindful of them? and the children of humanity, that thou visitest them?
- 5. For thou hast made them a little lower than the angels, and hast crowned them with glory and honour.
- 6. Thou madest them to have dominion over the works of thy hands; thou hast put all things under their feet:
- 7. All sheep and oxen, yea, and the beasts of the field;
- 8. The fowl of the air, and the fish of the sea, and whatsoever passeth through the paths of the seas.
- 9. O Lord our Lord, how excellent is thy name in all the earth!

<u>Prayers, spells, and intentions using Psalm 8</u>→

- 1. I will praise thee, O Lord, with my whole heart; I will shew forth all thy marvellous works.
- 2. I will be glad and rejoice in thee: I will sing praise to thy name, O thou most High.
- 3. When mine enemies are turned back, they shall fall and perish at thy presence.
- 4. For thou hast maintained my right and my cause; thou satest in the throne judging right.
- 5. Thou hast rebuked the heathen, thou hast destroyed the wicked, thou hast put out their name for ever and ever.
- 6. O thou enemy, destructions are come to a perpetual end: and thou hast destroyed cities; their memorial is perished with them.
- 7. But the Lord shall endure for ever: They have prepared Their throne for judgment.
- 8. And They shall judge the world in righteousness, They shall minister judgment to the people in uprightness.
- 9. The Lord also will be a refuge for the oppressed, a refuge in times of trouble.
- **10.** And they that know thy name will put their trust in thee: for thou, Lord, hast not forsaken them that seek thee.
- 11. Sing praises to the Lord, which dwelleth in Zion: declare among the people Her doings.
- 12. When They make inquisition for blood, They remember them: They forget not the cry of the humble.
- 13. Have mercy upon me, O Lord; consider my trouble which I suffer of them that hate me, thou that liftest me up from the gates of death:
- 14. That I may shew forth all thy praise in the gates of the daughter of Zion: I will rejoice in thy salvation.
- 15. The heathen are sunk down in the pit that they made: in the net which they hid is their own foot taken.
- 16. The Lord is known by the judgment which They execute: the wicked are snared in the work of their own hands. Higgaion. Selah.
- 17. The wicked shall be turned into hell, and all the nations that forget God.
- 18. For the needy shall not always be forgotten: the expectation of the poor shall not perish for ever.
- 19. Arise, O Lord; let not mortals prevail: let the heathen be judged in thy sight.
- 20. Put them in fear, O Lord: that the nations may know themselves to be but mortals. Selah.



- 1. Why standest thou afar off, O Lord? why hidest thou thyself in times of trouble?
- 2. The wicked in their pride doth persecute the poor: let them be taken in the devices that they have imagined.
- 3. For the wicked boasteth of their heart's desire, and blesseth the covetous, whom the Lord abhorreth.

- 4. The wicked, through the pride of their countenance, will not seek after God: God is not in all their thoughts.
- 5. Their ways are always grievous; thy judgments are far above out of their sight: as for all their enemies, they puffeth at them.
- 6. They have said in their heart, I shall not be moved: for I shall never be in adversity.
- 7. Their mouth is full of cursing and deceit and fraud: under their tongue is mischief and vanity.
- 8. They sit in the lurking places of the villages: in the secret places do they murder the innocent: their eyes are privily set against the poor.
- 9. They lie in wait secretly as a lion in their den: they lie in wait to catch the poor: they do catch the poor, when they draw them into their net.
- 10. They crouch, and humble themselves, that the poor may fall by their strong ones.
- 11. They have said in their heart, God hath forgotten: They hide Their face; They will never see it.
- 12. Arise, O Lord; O God, lift up thine hand: forget not the humble.
- 13. Wherefore doth the wicked contemn God? they have said in their heart, Thou wilt not require it.
- 14. Thou hast seen it; for thou beholdest mischief and spite, to requite it with thy hand: the poor committeth themselves unto thee; thou art the helper of the orphan.
- 15. Break thou the arm of the wicked and the evil person: seek out their wickedness till thou find none.
- 16. The Lord is Ruler for ever and ever: the heathen are perished out of Their land.
- 17. Lord, thou hast heard the desire of the humble: thou wilt prepare their heart, thou wilt cause thine ear to hear:
- **18.** To judge the orphan and the oppressed, that the wicked people of the earth may no more oppress.

Psalm 11

- 1. In the Lord put I my trust: how say ye to my soul, Flee as a bird to your mountain?
- 2. For, lo, the wicked bend their bow, they make ready their arrow upon the string, that they may privily shoot at the upright in heart.
- 3. If the foundations be destroyed, what can the righteous do?
- 4. The Lord is in Their holy temple, the Lord's throne is in heaven: Their eyes behold, Their eyelids try, all the people.
- 5. The Lord trieth the righteous: but the wicked and those that love violence Their soul hateth.
- **6.** Upon the wicked They shall rain snares, fire and brimstone, and an horrible tempest: this shall be the portion of their cup.
- 7. For the righteous Lord loveth righteousness; Their countenance doth behold the upright.

<u>Prayers, spells, and intentions using Psalm 11</u> → Back to the index \uparrow



- 1. Help, Lord; for the godly person ceaseth; for the faithful fail from among the children of humanity.
- 2. They speak vanity every one with their neighbour: with flattering lips and with a double heart do they speak.
- 3. The Lord shall cut off all flattering lips, and the tongue that speaketh proud things:
- 4. Who have said, With our tongue will we prevail; our lips are our own: who is lord over us?
- 5. For the oppression of the poor, for the sighing of the needy, now will I arise, saith the Lord; I will set them in safety from them that puffeth at them.
- 6. The words of the Lord are pure words: as silver tried in a furnace of earth, purified seven times.
- 7. Thou shalt keep them, O Lord, thou shalt preserve them from this generation for ever.
- 8. The wicked walk on every side, when the vilest are exalted.


Psalm 13

- 1. How long wilt thou forget me, O Lord? for ever? how long wilt thou hide thy face from me?
- 2. How long shall I take counsel in my soul, having sorrow in my heart daily? how long shall mine enemy be exalted over me?
- 3. Consider and hear me, O Lord my God: lighten mine eyes, lest I sleep the sleep of death;
- 4. Lest mine enemy say, I have prevailed against them; and those that trouble me rejoice when I am moved.
- 5. But I have trusted in thy mercy; my heart shall rejoice in thy salvation.
- 6. I will sing unto the Lord, because They have dealt bountifully with me.


Prayers, spells, and intentions using Psalm 13 \rightarrow Back to the index \uparrow

- 1. The fool hath said in their heart, There is no God. They are corrupt, they have done abominable works, there is none that doeth good.
- 2. The Lord looked down from heaven upon the children of humanity, to see if there were any that did understand, and seek God.
- 3. They are all gone aside, they are all together become filthy: there is none that doeth good, no, not one.

- 4. Have all the workers of iniquity no knowledge? who eat up my people as they eat bread, and call not upon the Lord.
- 5. There were they in great fear: for God is in the generation of the righteous.
- 6. Ye have shamed the counsel of the poor, because the Lord is their refuge.
- 7. Oh that the salvation of Israel were come out of Zion! when the Lord bringeth back the captivity of Their people, Jacob shall rejoice, and Israel shall be glad.



- 1. Lord, who shall abide in thy tabernacle? who shall dwell in thy holy hill?
- 2. They that walk uprightly, and work righteousness, and speak the truth in their heart.
- 3. They that backbite not with their tongue, nor doeth evil to their neighbour, nor taketh up a reproach against her neighbour.
- 4. In whose eyes a vile person is contemned; but they honour them that fear the Lord. They that swear to their own hurt, and changeth not.
- 5. They that put not out their money to usury, nor taketh reward against the innocent. They that doeth these things shall never be moved.




- Preserve me, O God: for in thee do I put my trust.
- 2. O my soul, thou hast said unto the Lord, Thou art my Lord: my goodness extendeth not to thee;
- 3. But to the saints that are in the earth, and to the excellent, in whom is all my delight.
- 4. Their sorrows shall be multiplied that hasten after another god: their drink offerings of blood will I not offer, nor take up their names into my lips.
- 5. The Lord is the portion of mine inheritance and of my cup: thou maintainest my lot.
- 6. The lines are fallen unto me in pleasant places; yea, I have a goodly heritage.
- 7. I will bless the Lord, who hath given me counsel: my reins also instruct me in the night seasons.
- 8. I have set the Lord always before me: because They are at my right hand, I shall not be moved.
- 9. Therefore my heart is glad, and my glory rejoiceth: my flesh also shall rest in hope.
- 10. For thou wilt not leave my soul in hell; neither wilt thou suffer thine Holy One to see corruption.
- 11. Thou wilt shew me the path of life: in thy presence is fulness of joy; at thy right hand there are pleasures for evermore.

Psalm 17


- 1. Hear the right, O Lord, attend unto my cry, give ear unto my prayer, that goeth not out of feigned lips.
- 2. Let my sentence come forth from thy presence; let thine eyes behold the things that are equal.
- 3. Thou hast proved mine heart; thou hast visited me in the night; thou hast tried me, and shalt find nothing; I am purposed that my mouth shall not transgress.
- 4. Concerning the works of others, by the word of thy lips I have kept me from the paths of the destroyer.
- 5. Hold up my goings in thy paths, that my footsteps slip not.
- 6. I have called upon thee, for thou wilt hear me, O God: incline thine ear unto me, and hear my speech.
- 7. Shew thy marvellous lovingkindness, O thou that savest by thy right hand them which put their trust in thee from those that rise up against them.
- 8. Keep me as the apple of the eye, hide me under the shadow of thy wings,
- 9. From the wicked that oppress me, from my deadly enemies, who compass me about.
- 10. They are inclosed in their own fat: with their mouth they speak proudly.
- 11. They have now compassed us in our steps: they have set their eyes bowing down to the earth;
- 12. Like as a lion that is greedy of its prey, and as it were a young lion lurking in secret places.
- **13.** Arise, O Lord, disappoint them, cast them down: deliver my soul from the wicked, which is thy sword:
- 14. From people which are thy hand, O Lord, from people of the world, which have their portion in this life, and whose belly thou fillest with thy hid treasure: they are full of children, and leave the rest of their substance to their babes.
- 15. As for me, I will behold thy face in righteousness: I shall be satisfied, when I awake, with thy likeness.



- 1. I will love thee, O Lord, my strength.
- 2. The Lord is my rock, and my fortress, and my deliverer; my God, my strength, in whom I will trust; my buckler, and the horn of my salvation, and my high tower.
- 3. I will call upon the Lord, who is worthy to be praised: so shall I be saved from mine enemies.
- 4. The sorrows of death compassed me, and the floods of the ungodly made me afraid.
- 5. The sorrows of hell compassed me about: the snares of death prevented me.
- 6. In my distress I called upon the Lord, and cried unto my God: They heard my voice out of Their temple,


- and my cry came before Them, even into Their ears.
- 7. Then the earth shook and trembled; the foundations also of the hills moved and were shaken, because They wer wroth.
- 8. There went up a smoke out of Her nostrils, and fire out of Her mouth devoured: coals were kindled by it.
- 9. They bowed the heavens also, and came down: and darkness was under Their feet.
- 10. And They rode upon a cherub, and did fly: yea, They did fly upon the wings of the wind.
- 11. They made darkness Their secret place; Their pavilion round about Them were dark waters and thick clouds of the skies.
- 12. At the brightness that was before Them Their thick clouds passed, hail stones and coals of fire.
- 13. The Lord also thundered in the heavens, and the Highest gave Their voice; hail stones and coals of fire.
- 14. Yea, They sent out Their arrows, and scattered them; and They shot out lightnings, and discomfited them.
- 15. Then the channels of waters were seen, and the foundations of the world were discovered at thy rebuke, O Lord, at the blast of the breath of thy nostrils.
- **16.** They sent from above, They took me, They drew me out of many waters.
- They delivered me from my strong enemy, and from them which hated me: for they were too strong for me.
- 18. They prevented me in the day of my calamity: but the Lord was my stay.
- 19. They brought me forth also into a large place; They delivered me, because They delighted in me.
- **20.** The Lord rewarded me according to my righteousness; according to the cleanness of my hands have They recompensed me.
- 21. For I have kept the ways of the Lord, and have not wickedly departed from my God.
- 22. For all Their judgments were before me, and I did not put away Their statutes from me.
- 23. I was also upright before Them, and I kept myself from mine iniquity.
- 24. Therefore hath the Lord recompensed me according to my righteousness, according to the cleanness of my hands in Their eyesight.
- 25. With the merciful thou wilt shew thyself merciful; with an upright person thou wilt shew thyself upright;
- 26. With the pure thou wilt shew thyself pure; and with the froward thou wilt shew thyself froward.
- 27. For thou wilt save the afflicted people; but wilt bring down high looks.
- 28. For thou wilt light my candle: the Lord my God will enlighten my darkness.
- 29. For by thee I have run through a troop; and by my God have I leaped over a wall.
- **30.** As for God, Their way is perfect: the word of the Lord is tried: They are a buckler to all those that trust in Them.
- 31. For who is God save the Lord? or who is a rock save our God?
- 32. It is God that girdeth me with strength, and maketh my way perfect.
- 33. They make my feet like hinds' feet, and set me upon my high places.
- 34. They teach my hands to war, so that a bow of steel is broken by mine arms.
- **35.** Thou hast also given me the shield of thy salvation: and thy right hand hath holden me up, and thy gentleness hath made me great.
- 36. Thou hast enlarged my steps under me, that my feet did not slip.
- 37. I have pursued mine enemies, and overtaken them: neither did I turn again till they were consumed.
- 38. I have wounded them that they were not able to rise: they are fallen under my feet.

- **39.** For thou hast girded me with strength unto the battle: thou hast subdued under me those that rose up against me.
- 40. Thou hast also given me the necks of mine enemies; that I might destroy them that hate me.
- 41. They cried, but there was none to save them: even unto the Lord, but They answered them not.
- 42. Then did I beat them small as the dust before the wind: I did cast them out as the dirt in the streets.
- **43.** Thou hast delivered me from the strivings of the people; and thou hast made me the head of the heathen: a people whom I have not known shall serve me.
- 44. As soon as they hear of me, they shall obey me: the strangers shall submit themselves unto me.
- 45. The strangers shall fade away, and be afraid out of their close places.
- **46.** The Lord liveth; and blessed be my rock; and let the God of my salvation be exalted.
- 47. It is God that avengeth me, and subdueth the people under me.
- **48.** They deliver me from mine enemies: yea, thou liftest me up above those that rise up against me: thou hast delivered me from the violent one.
- 49. Therefore will I give thanks unto thee, O Lord, among the heathen, and sing praises unto thy name.
- **50.** Great deliverance give They to Their ruler; and sheweth mercy to Their anointed, to the ruler, and to their seed for evermore.




- 1. The heavens declare the glory of God; and the firmament sheweth Their handywork.
- 2. Day unto day uttereth speech, and night unto night sheweth knowledge.
- 3. There is no speech nor language, where their voice is not heard.
- 4. Their line is gone out through all the earth, and their words to the end of the world. In them have They set a tabernacle for the sun,
- Which is as a newlywed coming out of their chamber, and rejoiceth as a champion to run a race.
- 6. Its going forth is from the end of the heaven, and its circuit unto the ends of it: and there is nothing hid from the heat thereof.
- 7. The law of the Lord is perfect, converting the soul: the testimony of the Lord is sure, making wise the simple.
- 8. The statutes of the Lord are right, rejoicing the heart: the commandment of the Lord is pure, enlightening the eyes.
- 9. The fear of the Lord is clean, enduring for ever: the judgments of the Lord are true and righteous altogether.
- **10.** More to be desired are they than gold, yea, than much fine gold: sweeter also than honey and the honeycomb.
- 11. Moreover by them is thy servant warned: and in keeping of them there is great reward.
- 12. Who can understand their errors? cleanse thou me from secret faults.
- 13. Keep back thy servant also from presumptuous sins; let them not have dominion over me: then shall I be upright, and I shall be innocent from the great transgression.

14. Let the words of my mouth, and the meditation of my heart, be acceptable in thy sight, O Lord, my strength, and my redeemer.



Psalm 20

- 1. The Lord hear thee in the day of trouble; the name of the God of Jacob defend thee;
- 2. Send thee help from the sanctuary, and strengthen thee out of Zion;
- 3. Remember all thy offerings, and accept thy burnt sacrifice; Selah.
- 4. Grant thee according to thine own heart, and fulfil all thy counsel.
- 5. We will rejoice in thy salvation, and in the name of our God we will set up our banners: the Lord fulfil all thy petitions.
- 6. Now know I that the Lord saveth Their anointed; They will hear them from Their holy heaven with the saving strength of Their right hand.
- 7. Some trust in chariots, and some in horses: but we will remember the name of the Lord our God.
- 8. They are brought down and fallen: but we are risen, and stand upright.
- 9. Save, Lord: let the Ruler hear us when we call.



- The ruler shall joy in thy strength, O Lord; and in thy salvation how greatly shall she rejoice!
- 2. Thou hast given them their heart's desire, and hast not withholden the request of their lips. Selah.
- 3. For thou preventest them with the blessings of goodness: thou settest a crown of pure gold on their head.
- 4. They asked life of thee, and thou gavest it them, even length of days for ever and ever.
- 5. Their glory is great in thy salvation: honour and majesty hast thou laid upon them.
- For thou hast made them most blessed for ever: thou hast made them exceeding glad with thy countenance.
- 7. For the ruler trusteth in the Lord, and through the mercy of the most High they shall not be moved.
- 8. Thine hand shall find out all thine enemies: thy right hand shall find out those that hate thee.
- 9. Thou shalt make them as a fiery oven in the time of thine anger: the Lord shall swallow them up in Their wrath, and the fire shall devour them.
- 10. Their fruit shalt thou destroy from the earth, and their seed from among the people.
- 11. For they intended evil against thee: they imagined a mischievous device, which they are not able to

perform.


- 12. Therefore shalt thou make them turn their back, when thou shalt make ready thine arrows upon thy strings against the face of them.
- 13. Be thou exalted, Lord, in thine own strength: so will we sing and praise thy power.



- 1. My God, my God, why hast thou forsaken me? why art thou so far from helping me, and from the words of my roaring?
- 2. O my God, I cry in the day time, but thou hearest not; and in the night season, and am not silent.
- 3. But thou art holy, O thou that inhabitest the praises of Israel.
- 4. Our ancestors trusted in thee: they trusted, and thou didst deliver them.
- 5. They cried unto thee, and were delivered: they trusted in thee, and were not confounded.
- 6. But I am a worm, and no human; a reproach of all, and despised of the people.
- 7. All they that see me laugh me to scorn: they shoot out the lip, they shake the head, saying,
- 8. They trusted on the Lord that They would deliver them: let Them deliver them, seeing they delighted in Them.
- 9. But thou art They that took me out of the womb: thou didst make me hope when I was being nursed.
- 10. I was cast upon thee from the womb: thou art my God from my birth.
- 11. Be not far from me; for trouble is near; for there is none to help.
- 12. Many bulls have compassed me: strong bulls of Bashan have beset me round.
- 13. They gaped upon me with their mouths, as a ravening and a roaring lion.
- 14. I am poured out like water, and all my bones are out of joint: my heart is like wax; it is melted in the midst of my bowels.
- 15. My strength is dried up like a potsherd; and my tongue cleaveth to my jaws; and thou hast brought me into the dust of death.
- 16. For dogs have compassed me: the assembly of the wicked have inclosed me: they pierced my hands and my feet.
- 17. I may tell all my bones: they look and stare upon me.
- **18.** They part my garments among them, and cast lots upon my vesture.
- 19. But be not thou far from me, O Lord: O my strength, haste thee to help me.
- **20.** Deliver my soul from the sword; my darling from the power of the dog.
- 21. Save me from the lion's mouth: for thou hast heard me from the horns of the unicorns.
- 22. I will declare thy name unto my peers: in the midst of the congregation will I praise thee.
- 23. Ye that fear the Lord, praise Them; all ye the seed of Jacob, glorify Them; and fear Them, all ye the seed of Israel.
- 24. For They have not despised nor abhorred the affliction of the afflicted; neither have They hid Their face

from them; but when they cried unto Them, They heard.

- 25. My praise shall be of thee in the great congregation: I will pay my vows before them that fear Them.
- 26. The meek shall eat and be satisfied: they shall praise the Lord that seek Them: your heart shall live for ever.
- 27. All the ends of the world shall remember and turn unto the Lord: and all the kindreds of the nations shall worship before thee.
- 28. For the dominion is the Lord's: and They are the governor among the nations.
- 29. All they that be fat upon earth shall eat and worship: all they that go down to the dust shall bow before Them: and none can keep alive their own soul.
- **30.** A seed shall serve Them; it shall be accounted to the Lord for a generation.
- 31. They shall come, and shall declare Her righteousness unto a people that shall be born, that They have done this.



Psalm 23

- 1. The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want.
- 2. They make me to lie down in green pastures: They lead me beside the still waters.
- 3. They restore my soul: they lead me in the paths of righteousness for their name's sake.
- 4. Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil: for thou art with me; thy rod and thy staff they comfort me.
- 5. Thou preparest a table before me in the presence of mine enemies: thou anointest my head with oil; my cup runneth over.
- 6. Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life: and I will dwell in the house of the Lord for ever.



- 1. The earth is the Lord's, and the fulness thereof; the world, and they that dwell therein.
- 2. For they have founded it upon the seas, and established it upon the floods.
- 3. Who shall ascend into the hill of the Lord? or who shall stand in their holy place?
- 4. They that have clean hands, and a pure heart; who hath not lifted up their soul unto vanity, nor sworn deceitfully.
- 5. They shall receive the blessing from the Lord, and righteousness from the God of their salvation.

- 6. This is the generation of them that seek them, that seek thy face, O Jacob. Selah.
- 7. Lift up your heads, O ye gates; and be ye lift up, ye everlasting doors; and the Ruler of glory shall come in.
- 8. Who is this Ruler of glory? The Lord strong and mighty, the Lord mighty in battle.
- 9. Lift up your heads, O ye gates; even lift them up, ye everlasting doors; and the Ruler of glory shall come in.
- 10. Who is this Ruler of glory? The Lord of hosts, they are the Ruler of glory. Selah.

- 14. The secret of the Lord is with them that fear Them; and They will shew them Their covenant.
- 15. Mine eyes are ever toward the Lord; for They shall pluck my feet out of the net.
- 16. Turn thee unto me, and have mercy upon me; for I am desolate and afflicted.
- 17. The troubles of my heart are enlarged: O bring thou me out of my distresses.
- **18.** Look upon mine affliction and my pain; and forgive all my sins.
- 19. Consider mine enemies; for they are many; and they hate me with cruel hatred.
- 20. O keep my soul, and deliver me: let me not be ashamed; for I put my trust in thee.
- 21. Let integrity and uprightness preserve me; for I wait on thee.
- 22. Redeem Israel, O God, out of all their troubles.



- 4. I have not sat with vain persons, neither will I go in with dissemblers.
- 5. I have hated the congregation of evil doers; and will not sit with the wicked.
- 6. I will wash mine hands in innocency: so will I compass thine altar, O Lord:
- 7. That I may publish with the voice of thanksgiving, and tell of all thy wondrous works.
- 8. Lord, I have loved the habitation of thy house, and the place where thine honour dwelleth.
- 9. Gather not my soul with sinners, nor my life with bloodthirsty people:
- 10. In whose hands is mischief, and their right hand is full of bribes.
- 11. But as for me, I will walk in mine integrity: redeem me, and be merciful unto me.
- 12. My foot standeth in an even place: in the congregations will I bless the Lord.



- 1. The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear? the Lord is the strength of my life; of whom shall I be afraid?
- 2. When the wicked, even mine enemies and my foes, came upon me to eat up my flesh, they stumbled and fell.
- 3. Though an host should encamp against me, my heart shall not fear: though war should rise against me, in this will I be confident.
- 4. One thing have I desired of the Lord, that will I seek after; that I may dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life, to behold the beauty of the Lord, and to enquire in their temple.
- 5. For in the time of trouble They shall hide me in their pavilion: in the secret of Their tabernacle shall They hide me; They shall set me up upon a rock.
- 6. And now shall mine head be lifted up above mine enemies round about me: therefore will I offer in Their tabernacle sacrifices of joy; I will sing, yea, I will sing praises unto the Lord.
- 7. Hear, O Lord, when I cry with my voice: have mercy also upon me, and answer me.

- 12. Deliver me not over unto the will of mine enemies: for false witnesses are risen up against me, and such as breathe out cruelty.
- 13. I had fainted, unless I had believed to see the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living.
- 14. Wait on the Lord: be of good courage, and They shall strengthen thine heart: wait, I say, on the Lord.




- 1. Unto thee will I cry, O Lord my rock; be not silent to me: lest, if thou be silent to me, I become like them that go down into the pit.
- 2. Hear the voice of my supplications, when I cry unto thee, when I lift up my hands toward thy holy oracle.

- 1. Give unto the Lord, O ye mighty, give unto the Lord glory and strength.
- 2. Give unto the Lord the glory due unto Their name; worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness.
- 3. The voice of the Lord is upon the waters: the God of glory thundereth: the Lord is upon many waters.
- 4. The voice of the Lord is powerful; the voice of the Lord is full of majesty.
- 5. The voice of the Lord breaketh the cedars; yea, the Lord breaketh the cedars of Lebanon.
- 6. She maketh them also to skip like a calf; Lebanon and Sirion like a young unicorn.
- 7. The voice of the Lord divideth the flames of fire.
- 8. The voice of the Lord shaketh the wilderness; the Lord shaketh the wilderness of Kadesh.

- 9. The voice of the Lord maketh the hinds to calve, and discovereth the forests: and in Their temple doth every one speak of Their glory.
- 10. The Lord sitteth upon the flood; yea, the Lord sitteth Ruler for ever.
- 11. The Lord will give strength unto Their people; the Lord will bless Their people with peace.



- 1. I will extol thee, O Lord; for thou hast lifted me up, and hast not made my foes to rejoice over me.
- 2. O Lord my God, I cried unto thee, and thou hast healed me.
- 3. O Lord, thou hast brought up my soul from the grave: thou hast kept me alive, that I should not go down to the pit.
- 4. Sing unto the Lord, O ye saints of Theirs, and give thanks at the remembrance of Their holiness.
- 5. For Their anger endureth but a moment; in Their favour is life: weeping may endure for a night, but joy cometh in the morning.
- 6. And in my prosperity I said, I shall never be moved.
- Lord, by thy favour thou hast made my mountain to stand strong: thou didst hide thy face, and I was troubled.

- 9. What profit is there in my blood, when I go down to the pit? Shall the dust praise thee? shall it declare thy truth?
- 10. Hear, O Lord, and have mercy upon me: Lord, be thou my helper.
- 11. Thou hast turned for me my mourning into dancing: thou hast put off my sackcloth, and girded me with gladness;
- 12. To the end that my glory may sing praise to thee, and not be silent. O Lord my God, I will give thanks unto thee for ever.




- 1. In thee, O Lord, do I put my trust; let me never be ashamed: deliver me in thy righteousness.
- 2. Bow down thine ear to me; deliver me speedily: be thou my strong rock, for an house of defence to save me.
- 3. For thou art my rock and my fortress; therefore for thy name's sake lead me, and guide me.
- 4. Pull me out of the net that they have laid privily for me: for thou art my strength.

- 5. Into thine hand I commit my spirit: thou hast redeemed me, O Lord God of truth.
- 6. I have hated them that regard lying vanities: but I trust in the Lord.
- 7. I will be glad and rejoice in thy mercy: for thou hast considered my trouble; thou hast known my soul in adversities:
- 8. And hast not shut me up into the hand of the enemy: thou hast set my feet in a large room.
- **9.** Have mercy upon me, O Lord, for I am in trouble: mine eye is consumed with grief, yea, my soul and my belly.
- **10.** For my life is spent with grief, and my years with sighing: my strength faileth because of mine iniquity, and my bones are consumed.
- 11. I was a reproach among all mine enemies, but especially among my neighbours, and a fear to mine acquaintance: they that did see me without fled from me.
- 12. I am forgotten as a dead person out of mind: I am like a broken vessel.
- 13. For I have heard the slander of many: fear was on every side: while they took counsel together against me, they devised to take away my life.
- 14. But I trusted in thee, O Lord: I said, Thou art my God.
- 15. My times are in thy hand: deliver me from the hand of mine enemies, and from them that persecute me.
- **16.** Make thy face to shine upon thy servant: save me for thy mercies' sake.
- 17. Let me not be ashamed, O Lord; for I have called upon thee: let the wicked be ashamed, and let them be silent in the grave.
- **18.** Let the lying lips be put to silence; which speak grievous things proudly and contemptuously against the righteous.
- 19. Oh how great is thy goodness, which thou hast laid up for them that fear thee; which thou hast wrought for them that trust in thee before others!
- 20. Thou shalt hide them in the secret of thy presence from the pride of others: thou shalt keep them secretly in a pavilion from the strife of tongues.
- 21. Blessed be the Lord: for They have shewed me Her marvellous kindness in a strong city.
- 22. For I said in my haste, I am cut off from before thine eyes: nevertheless thou heardest the voice of my supplications when I cried unto thee.
- 23. O love the Lord, all ye Their saints: for the Lord preserveth the faithful, and plentifully rewardeth the proud doer.
- 24. Be of good courage, and They shall strengthen your heart, all ye that hope in the Lord.



- 1. Blessed are they whose transgression is forgiven, whose sin is covered.
- 2. Blessed is the person unto whom the Lord imputeth not iniquity, and in whose spirit there is no quile.
- 3. When I kept silence, my bones waxed old through my roaring all the day long.
- **4.** For day and night thy hand was heavy upon me: my moisture is turned into the drought of summer. Selah.

- 5. I acknowledge my sin unto thee, and mine iniquity have I not hid. I said, I will confess my transgressions unto the Lord; and thou forgavest the iniquity of my sin. Selah.
- 6. For this shall every one that is godly pray unto thee in a time when thou mayest be found: surely in the floods of great waters they shall not come nigh unto him.
- 7. Thou art my hiding place; thou shalt preserve me from trouble; thou shalt compass me about with songs of deliverance. Selah.
- 8. I will instruct thee and teach thee in the way which thou shalt go: I will guide thee with mine eye.
- 9. Be ye not as the horse, or as the mule, which have no understanding: whose mouth must be held in with bit and bridle, lest they come near unto thee.
- 10. Many sorrows shall be to the wicked: but they that trust in the Lord, mercy shall compass them about.
- 11. Be glad in the Lord, and rejoice, ye righteous: and shout for joy, all ye that are upright in heart.




- 1. Rejoice in the Lord, O ye righteous: for praise is comely for the upright.
- 2. Praise the Lord with harp: sing unto Them with the psaltery and an instrument of ten strings.
- 3. Sing unto Them a new song; play skilfully with a loud noise.
- 4. For the word of the Lord is right; and all Their works are done in truth.
- 5. They love righteousness and judgment: the earth is full of the goodness of the Lord.
- 6. By the word of the Lord were the heavens made; and all the host of them by the breath of Her mouth.
- 7. They gather the waters of the sea together as an heap: They lay up the depth in storehouses.
- 8. Let all the earth fear the Lord: let all the inhabitants of the world stand in awe of Them.
- 9. For They spake, and it was done; They commanded, and it stood fast.
- 10. The Lord bringeth the counsel of the heathen to nought: They make the devices of the people of none effect.
- 11. The counsel of the Lord standeth for ever, the thoughts of Their heart to all generations.
- 12. Blessed is the nation whose God is the Lord; and the people whom They have chosen for Their own inheritance.
- 13. The Lord looketh from heaven; They behold all the people.
- 14. From the place of Their habitation They look upon all the inhabitants of the earth.
- 15. They fashion their hearts alike; They consider all their works.
- 16. There is no ruler saved by the multitude of an host: a warrior is not delivered by much strength.
- 17. An horse is a vain thing for safety: neither shall it deliver any by its great strength.
- 18. Behold, the eye of the Lord is upon them that fear Them, upon them that hope in Their mercy;
- 19. To deliver their soul from death, and to keep them alive in famine.
- 20. Our soul waiteth for the Lord: They are our help and our shield.

- 21. For our heart shall rejoice in Them, because we have trusted in Their holy name.
- 22. Let thy mercy, O Lord, be upon us, according as we hope in thee.

Psalm 34

- 1. I will bless the Lord at all times: Their praise shall continually be in my mouth.
- 2. My soul shall make its boast in the Lord: the humble shall hear thereof, and be glad.
- 3. O magnify the Lord with me, and let us exalt Their name together.
- 4. I sought the Lord, and They heard me, and delivered me from all my fears.
- 5. They looked unto Them, and were lightened: and their faces were not ashamed.
- 6. This poor person cried, and the Lord heard them, and saved them out of all their troubles.
- 7. The angel of the Lord encampeth round about them that fear Them, and delivereth them.
- 8. O taste and see that the Lord is good: blessed are they that trusteth in Them.
- 9. O fear the Lord, ye Their saints: for there is no want to them that fear Them.
- 10. The young lions do lack, and suffer hunger: but they that seek the Lord shall not want any good thing.
- 11. Come, ye children, hearken unto me: I will teach you the fear of the Lord.
- 12. What person are they that desireth life, and loveth many days, that they may see good?
- 13. Keep thy tongue from evil, and thy lips from speaking guile.
- 14. Depart from evil, and do good; seek peace, and pursue it.
- 15. The eyes of the Lord are upon the righteous, and Their ears are open unto their cry.
- 16. The face of the Lord is against them that do evil, to cut off the remembrance of them from the earth.
- 17. The righteous cry, and the Lord heareth, and delivereth them out of all their troubles.
- 18. The Lord is nigh unto them that are of a broken heart; and saveth such as be of a contrite spirit.
- 19. Many are the afflictions of the righteous: but the Lord delivereth them out of them all.
- 20. They keep all their bones: not one of them is broken.
- 21. Evil shall slay the wicked: and they that hate the righteous shall be desolate.
- 22. The Lord redeemeth the soul of their servants: and none of them that trust in Them shall be desolate.



- 1. Plead my cause, O Lord, with them that strive with me: fight against them that fight against me.
- 2. Take hold of shield and buckler, and stand up for mine help.
- Draw out also the spear, and stop the way against them that persecute me: say unto my soul, I am thy salvation.
- 4. Let them be confounded and put to shame that seek after my soul: let them be turned back and brought to confusion that devise my hurt.
- 5. Let them be as chaff before the wind: and let the angel of the Lord chase them.
- 6. Let their way be dark and slippery: and let the angel of the Lord persecute them.
- 7. For without cause have they hid for me their net in a pit, which without cause they have digged for my soul.
- 8. Let destruction come upon them at unawares; and let their net that they hath hid catch themselves: into that very destruction let them fall.
- 9. And my soul shall be joyful in the Lord: it shall rejoice in Their salvation.
- **10.** All my bones shall say, Lord, who is like unto thee, which deliverest the poor from them that are too strong for them, yea, the poor and the needy from them that spoileth them?
- 11. False witnesses did rise up; they laid to my charge things that I knew not.
- 12. They rewarded me evil for good to the spoiling of my soul.
- 13. But as for me, when they were sick, my clothing was sackcloth: I humbled my soul with fasting; and my prayer returned into mine own bosom.
- 14. I behaved myself as though they had been my friend or family: I bowed down heavily, as one that mourneth for their parent.
- **15.** But in mine adversity they rejoiced, and gathered themselves together: yea, the abjects gathered themselves together against me, and I knew it not; they did tear me, and ceased not:
- 16. With hypocritical mockers in feasts, they gnashed upon me with their teeth.
- 17. Lord, how long wilt thou look on? rescue my soul from their destructions, my darling from the lions.
- 18. I will give thee thanks in the great congregation: I will praise thee among much people.
- 19. Let not them that are mine enemies wrongfully rejoice over me: neither let them wink with the eye that hate me without a cause.
- 20. For they speak not peace: but they devise deceitful matters against them that are quiet in the land.
- 21. Yea, they opened their mouth wide against me, and said, Aha, aha, our eye hath seen it.
- 22. This thou hast seen, O Lord: keep not silence: O Lord, be not far from me.
- 23. Stir up thyself, and awake to my judgment, even unto my cause, my God and my Lord.
- 24. Judge me, O Lord my God, according to thy righteousness; and let them not rejoice over me.
- 25. Let them not say in their hearts, Ah, so would we have it: let them not say, We have swallowed them up.
- 26. Let them be ashamed and brought to confusion together that rejoice at mine hurt: let them be clothed with shame and dishonour that magnify themselves against me.
- 27. Let them shout for joy, and be glad, that favour my righteous cause: yea, let them say continually, Let the Lord be magnified, which hath pleasure in the prosperity of Their servant.
- 28. And my tongue shall speak of thy righteousness and of thy praise all the day long.

- 1. The transgression of the wicked saith within my heart, that there is no fear of God before their eyes.
- 2. For they flatter themselves in their own eyes, until their iniquity be found to be hateful.
- 3. The words of their mouth are iniquity and deceit: they have left off to be wise, and to do good.
- 4. They devise mischief upon their bed; they set themselves in a way that is not good; they abhor not evil.
- 5. Thy mercy, O Lord, is in the heavens; and thy faithfulness reacheth unto the clouds.
- 6. Thy righteousness is like the great mountains; thy judgments are a great deep: O Lord, thou preservest people and animals.
- 7. How excellent is thy lovingkindness, O God! therefore the people put their trust under the shadow of thy wings.
- 8. They shall be abundantly satisfied with the fatness of thy house; and thou shalt make them drink of the river of thy pleasures.
- 9. For with thee is the fountain of life: in thy light shall we see light.
- 10. O continue thy lovingkindness unto them that know thee; and thy righteousness to the upright in heart.
- 11. Let not the foot of pride come against me, and let not the hand of the wicked remove me.
- 12. There are the workers of iniquity fallen: they are cast down, and shall not be able to rise.



- 1. Fret not thyself because of evildoers, neither be thou envious against the workers of iniquity.
- 2. For they shall soon be cut down like the grass, and wither as the green herb.
- 3. Trust in the Lord, and do good; so shalt thou dwell in the land, and verily thou shalt be fed.
- 4. Delight thyself also in the Lord: and They shall give thee the desires of thine heart.
- 5. Commit thy way unto the Lord; trust also in Them; and They shall bring it to pass.
- 6. And They shall bring forth thy righteousness as the light, and thy judgment as the noonday.
- 7. Rest in the Lord, and wait patiently for Them: fret not thyself because of them who prospereth in their way, because of the person who bringeth wicked devices to pass.
- 8. Cease from anger, and forsake wrath: fret not thyself in any wise to do evil.
- 9. For evildoers shall be cut off: but those that wait upon the Lord, they shall inherit the earth.
- 10. For yet a little while, and the wicked shall not be: yea, thou shalt diligently consider their place, and it shall not be.
- 11. But the meek shall inherit the earth; and shall delight themselves in the abundance of peace.
- 12. The wicked plotteth against the just, and gnasheth upon them with their teeth.

- 13. The Lord shall laugh at them for They see that their day is coming.
- 14. The wicked have drawn out the sword, and have bent their bow, to cast down the poor and needy, and to slay such as be of upright conversation.
- 15. Their sword shall enter into their own heart, and their bows shall be broken.
- 16. A little that a righteous person hath is better than the riches of many wicked.
- 17. For the arms of the wicked shall be broken: but the Lord upholdeth the righteous.
- 18. The Lord knoweth the days of the upright: and their inheritance shall be for ever.
- 19. They shall not be ashamed in the evil time: and in the days of famine they shall be satisfied.
- 20. But the wicked shall perish, and the enemies of the Lord shall be as the fat of lambs: they shall consume; into smoke shall they consume away.
- 21. The wicked borroweth, and payeth not again: but the righteous sheweth mercy, and giveth.
- 22. For such as be blessed of Them shall inherit the earth; and they that be cursed of Them shall be cut off.
- 23. The steps of a good person are ordered by the Lord: and they delight in Their way.
- 24. Though they fall, they shall not be utterly cast down: for the Lord upholdeth them with Their hand.
- 25. I have been young, and now am old; yet have I not seen the righteous forsaken, nor their seed begging bread.
- **26.** They are ever merciful, and lend; and their seed is blessed.
- 27. Depart from evil, and do good; and dwell for evermore.
- 28. For the Lord loveth judgment, and forsaketh not their saints; they are preserved for ever: but the seed of the wicked shall be cut off.
- 29. The righteous shall inherit the land, and dwell therein for ever.
- 30. The mouth of the righteous speaketh wisdom, and their tongue talketh of judgment.
- 31. The law of their God is in their heart; none of their steps shall slide.
- **32.** The wicked watcheth the righteous, and seeketh to slay them.
- 33. The Lord will not leave them in their hand, nor condemn them when they are judged.
- 34. Wait on the Lord, and keep Their way, and They shall exalt thee to inherit the land: when the wicked are cut off, thou shalt see it.
- 35. I have seen the wicked in great power, and spreading themselves like a green bay tree.
- 36. Yet they passed away, and, lo, they were not: yea, I sought them, but they could not be found.
- 37. Mark the perfect person, and behold the upright: for the end of that person is peace.
- 38. But the transgressors shall be destroyed together: the end of the wicked shall be cut off.
- 39. But the salvation of the righteous is of the Lord: They are their strength in the time of trouble.
- **40.** And the Lord shall help them, and deliver them: They shall deliver them from the wicked, and save them, because they trust in Them.

- 1. O Lord, rebuke me not in thy wrath: neither chasten me in thy hot displeasure.
- 2. For thine arrows stick fast in me, and thy hand presseth me sore.
- There is no soundness in my flesh because of thine anger; neither is there any rest in my bones because of my sin.
- 4. For mine iniquities are gone over mine head: as an heavy burden they are too heavy for me.
- 5. My wounds stink and are corrupt because of my foolishness.
- 6. I am troubled; I am bowed down greatly; I go mourning all the day long.
- 7. For my loins are filled with a loathsome disease: and there is no soundness in my flesh.
- 8. I am feeble and sore broken: I have roared by reason of the disquietness of my heart.
- 9. Lord, all my desire is before thee; and my groaning is not hid from thee.
- 10. My heart panteth, my strength faileth me: as for the light of mine eyes, it also is gone from me.
- 11. My lovers and my friends stand aloof from my sore; and my kinsmen stand afar off.
- 12. They also that seek after my life lay snares for me: and they that seek my hurt speak mischievous things, and imagine deceits all the day long.
- 13. But I, as a deaf person, heard not; and I was as a mute person that openeth not their mouth.
- 14. Thus I was as a person that heareth not, and in whose mouth are no reproofs.
- 15. For in thee, O Lord, do I hope: thou wilt hear, O Lord my God.
- **16.** For I said, Hear me, lest otherwise they should rejoice over me: when my foot slippeth, they magnify themselves against me.
- 17. For I am ready to halt, and my sorrow is continually before me.
- 18. For I will declare mine iniquity; I will be sorry for my sin.
- 19. But mine enemies are lively, and they are strong: and they that hate me wrongfully are multiplied.
- 20. They also that render evil for good are mine adversaries; because I follow the thing that good is.
- 21. Forsake me not, O Lord: O my God, be not far from me.
- 22. Make haste to help me, O Lord my salvation.



- 1. I said, I will take heed to my ways, that I sin not with my tongue: I will keep my mouth with a bridle, while the wicked is before me.
- 2. I was dumb with silence, I held my peace, even from good; and my sorrow was stirred.
- 3. My heart was hot within me, while I was musing the fire burned: then spake I with my tongue,
- 4. Lord, make me to know mine end, and the measure of my days, what it is: that I may know how frail I am.
- 5. Behold, thou hast made my days as an handbreadth; and mine age is as nothing before thee: verily every person at their best state is altogether vanity. Selah.

- 6. Surely every person walketh in a vain shew: surely they are disquieted in vain: they heap up riches, and know not who shall gather them.
- 7. And now, Lord, what wait I for? my hope is in thee.
- 8. Deliver me from all my transgressions: make me not the reproach of the foolish.
- 9. I was dumb, I opened not my mouth; because thou didst it.
- 10. Remove thy stroke away from me: I am consumed by the blow of thine hand.
- 11. When thou with rebukes dost correct a person for iniquity, thou makest their beauty to consume away like a moth: surely every person is vanity. Selah.
- 12. Hear my prayer, O Lord, and give ear unto my cry; hold not thy peace at my tears: for I am a stranger with thee, and a sojourner, as all my ancestors were.
- 13. O spare me, that I may recover strength, before I go hence, and be no more.

- 1. I waited patiently for the Lord; and They inclined unto me, and heard my cry.
- 2. They brought me up also out of an horrible pit, out of the miry clay, and set my feet upon a rock, and established my goings.
- 3. And They have put a new song in my mouth, even praise unto our God: many shall see it, and fear, and shall trust in the Lord.
- 4. Blessed is that person that maketh the Lord their trust, and respecteth not the proud, nor such as turn aside to lies.
- 5. Many, O Lord my God, are thy wonderful works which thou hast done, and thy thoughts which are to us-ward: they cannot be reckoned up in order unto thee: if I would declare and speak of them, they are more than can be numbered.
- 6. Sacrifice and offering thou didst not desire; mine ears hast thou opened: burnt offering and sin offering hast thou not required.
- 7. Then said I, Lo, I come: in the volume of the book it is written of me,
- 8. I delight to do thy will, O my God: yea, thy law is within my heart.
- 9. I have preached righteousness in the great congregation: lo, I have not refrained my lips, O Lord, thou knowest.
- 10. I have not hid thy righteousness within my heart; I have declared thy faithfulness and thy salvation: I have not concealed thy lovingkindness and thy truth from the great congregation.
- 11. Withhold not thou thy tender mercies from me, O Lord: let thy lovingkindness and thy truth continually preserve me.
- 12. For innumerable evils have compassed me about: mine iniquities have taken hold upon me, so that I am not able to look up; they are more than the hairs of mine head: therefore my heart faileth me.
- 13. Be pleased, O Lord, to deliver me: O Lord, make haste to help me.
- 14. Let them be ashamed and confounded together that seek after my soul to destroy it; let them be driven backward and put to shame that wish me evil.
- 15. Let them be desolate for a reward of their shame that say unto me, Aha, aha.

- 16. Let all those that seek thee rejoice and be glad in thee: let such as love thy salvation say continually, The Lord be magnified.
- 17. But I am poor and needy; yet the Lord thinketh upon me: thou art my help and my deliverer; make no tarrying, O my God.



- 1. Blessed are they that consider the poor: the Lord will deliver them in time of trouble.
- 2. The Lord will preserve them, and keep them alive; and they shall be blessed upon the earth: and thou wilt not deliver them unto the will of their enemies.
- 3. The Lord will strengthen them upon the bed of languishing: thou wilt make all their bed in their sickness.
- 4. I said, Lord, be merciful unto me: heal my soul; for I have sinned against thee.
- 5. Mine enemies speak evil of me, When shall they die, and their name perish?
- 6. And if they come to see me, they speak vanity: their heart gathereth iniquity to itself; when they go abroad, they tell it.
- 7. All that hate me whisper together against me: against me do they devise my hurt.
- 8. An evil disease, say they, cleaveth fast unto them: and now that they lie down they shall rise up no more.
- 9. Yea, mine own familiar friend, in whom I trusted, which did eat of my bread, hath lifted up their heel against me.
- 10. But thou, O Lord, be merciful unto me, and raise me up, that I may requite them.
- 11. By this I know that thou favourest me, because mine enemy doth not triumph over me.
- 12. And as for me, thou upholdest me in mine integrity, and settest me before thy face for ever.
- 13. Blessed be the Lord God of Israel from everlasting, and to everlasting. Amen, and Amen.



- 1. As the deer panteth after the water brooks, so panteth my soul after thee, O God.
- 2. My soul thirsteth for God, for the living God: when shall I come and appear before God?
- 3. My tears have been my meat day and night, while they continually say unto me, Where is thy God?
- 4. When I remember these things, I pour out my soul in me: for I had gone with the multitude, I went with them to the house of God, with the voice of joy and praise, with a multitude that kept holyday.
- 5. Why art thou cast down, O my soul? and why art thou disquieted in me? hope thou in God: for I shall yet praise Them for the help of Their countenance.

- 6. O my God, my soul is cast down within me: therefore will I remember thee from the land of Jordan, and of the Hermonites, from the hill Mizar.
- 7. Deep calleth unto deep at the noise of thy waterspouts: all thy waves and thy billows are gone over me.
- 8. Yet the Lord will command Their lovingkindness in the day time, and in the night Their song shall be with me, and my prayer unto the God of my life.
- 9. I will say unto God my rock, Why hast thou forgotten me? why go I mourning because of the oppression of the enemy?
- 10. As with a sword in my bones, mine enemies reproach me; while they say daily unto me, Where is thy God?
- 11. Why art thou cast down, O my soul? and why art thou disquieted within me? hope thou in God: for I shall yet praise Them, who is the health of my countenance, and my God.



- 1. Judge me, O God, and plead my cause against an ungodly nation: O deliver me from the deceitful and the unjust.
- 2. For thou art the God of my strength: why dost thou cast me off? why go I mourning because of the oppression of the enemy?
- 3. O send out thy light and thy truth: let them lead me; let them bring me unto thy holy hill, and to thy tabernacles.
- 4. Then will I go unto the altar of God, unto God my exceeding joy: yea, upon the harp will I praise thee, O God my God.
- 5. Why art thou cast down, O my soul? and why art thou disquieted within me? hope in God: for I shall yet praise Them, who is the health of my countenance, and my God.



- 1. We have heard with our ears, O God, our ancestors have told us, what work thou didst in their days, in the times of old.
- 2. How thou didst drive out the heathen with thy hand, and plantedst them; how thou didst afflict the people, and cast them out.
- 3. For they got not the land in possession by their own sword, neither did their own arm save them: but thy right hand, and thine arm, and the light of thy countenance, because thou hadst a favour unto them.
- 4. Thou art my Ruler, O God: command deliverances for Jacob.
- 5. Through thee will we push down our enemies: through thy name will we tread them under that rise up against us.

- 6. For I will not trust in my bow, neither shall my sword save me.
- 7. But thou hast saved us from our enemies, and hast put them to shame that hated us.
- 8. In God we boast all the day long, and praise thy name for ever. Selah.
- 9. But thou hast cast off, and put us to shame; and goest not forth with our armies.
- **10.** Thou makest us to turn back from the enemy: and they which hate us spoil for themselves.
- 11. Thou hast given us like sheep appointed for meat; and hast scattered us among the heathen.
- 12. Thou sellest thy people for nought, and dost not increase thy wealth by their price.
- 13. Thou makest us a reproach to our neighbours, a scorn and a derision to them that are round about us.
- 14. Thou makest us a byword among the heathen, a shaking of the head among the people.
- 15. My confusion is continually before me, and the shame of my face hath covered me,
- 16. For the voice of those that reproach and blaspheme; by reason of the enemy and avenger.
- 17. All this is come upon us; yet have we not forgotten thee, neither have we dealt falsely in thy covenant.
- 18. Our heart is not turned back, neither have our steps declined from thy way;
- 19. Though thou hast sore broken us in the place of dragons, and covered us with the shadow of death.
- 20. If we have forgotten the name of our God, or stretched out our hands to a strange god;
- 21. Shall not God search this out? for They know the secrets of the heart.
- 22. Yea, for thy sake are we killed all the day long; we are counted as sheep for the slaughter.
- 23. Awake, why sleepest thou, O Lord? arise, cast us not off for ever.



- 1. My heart is inditing a good matter: I speak of the things which I have made touching the queen: my tongue is the pen of a ready writer.
- 2. Thou art fairer than the children of humanity: grace is poured into thy lips: therefore God hath blessed thee for ever.
- 3. Gird thy sword upon thy thigh, O most mighty, with thy glory and thy majesty.
- 4. And in thy majesty ride prosperously because of truth and meekness and righteousness; and thy right hand shall teach thee terrible things.
- 5. Thine arrows are sharp in the heart of the ruler's enemies; whereby the people fall under thee.
- 6. Thy throne, O God, is for ever and ever: the sceptre of thy kingdom is a right sceptre.
- 7. Thou lovest righteousness, and hatest wickedness: therefore God, thy God, hath anointed thee with the oil of gladness above thy fellows.
- 8. All thy garments smell of myrrh, and aloes, and cassia, out of the ivory palaces, whereby they have made thee glad.
- **9.** Rulers' children were among thy honourable people: upon thy right hand did stand the ruler in gold of Ophir.

- **10.** Hearken, O child, and consider, and incline thine ear; forget also thine own people, and thy parents' house;
- 11. So shall the ruler greatly desire thy beauty: for they are thy Lord; and worship thou them.
- 12. And the descendent of Tyre shall be there with a gift; even the rich among the people shall intreat thy favour.
- 13. The ruler's begotten is all glorious within: their clothing is of wrought gold.
- 14. They shall be brought unto the ruler in raiment of needlework: the unmarried their companions that follow them shall be brought unto thee.
- 15. With gladness and rejoicing shall they be brought: they shall enter into the ruler's palace.
- 16. Instead of thy parents shall be thy children, whom thou mayest make rulers in all the earth.
- 17. I will make thy name to be remembered in all generations: therefore shall the people praise thee for ever and ever.



- 1. God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble.
- 2. Therefore will not we fear, though the earth be removed, and though the mountains be carried into the midst of the sea;
- 3. Though the waters thereof roar and be troubled, though the mountains shake with the swelling thereof. Selah.
- 4. There is a river, the streams whereof shall make glad the city of God, the holy place of the tabernacles of the most High.
- 5. God is in the midst of that; it shall not be moved: God shall help Their city, and that right early.
- 6. The heathen raged, the kingdoms were moved: They uttered Their voice, the earth melted.
- 7. The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge. Selah.
- 8. Come, behold the works of the Lord, what desolations They have made in the earth.
- **9.** They make wars to cease unto the end of the earth; They break the bow, and cut the spear in sunder; They burn the chariot in the fire.
- 10. Be still, and know that I am God: I will be exalted among the heathen, I will be exalted in the earth.




Psalm 47

1. O clap your hands, all ye people; shout unto God with the voice of triumph.

- 2. For the Lord most high is terrible; They are a great Ruler over all the earth.
- 3. They shall subdue the people under us, and the nations under our feet.
- 4. They shall choose our inheritance for us, the excellency of Jacob whom They loved. Selah.
- 5. God is gone up with a shout, the Lord with the sound of a trumpet.
- 6. Sing praises to God, sing praises: sing praises unto our Ruler, sing praises.
- 7. For God is the Ruler of all the earth: sing ye praises with understanding.
- 8. God reigneth over the heathen: God sitteth upon the throne of Their holiness.
- **9.** The rulers of the people are gathered together, even the people of the God of Abraham: for the shields of the earth belong unto God: They are greatly exalted.



- 1. Great is the Lord, and greatly to be praised in the city of our God, in the mountain of Their holiness.
- 2. Beautiful for situation, the joy of the whole earth, is mount Zion, on the sides of the north, the city of the great Ruler.
- 3. God is known in its palaces for a refuge.
- **4.** For, lo, the rulers were assembled, they passed by together.
- 5. They saw it, and so they marvelled; they were troubled, and hasted away.
- 6. Fear took hold upon them there, and pain, as of a person in labour.
- 7. Thou breakest the ships of Tarshish with an east wind.
- 8. As we have heard, so have we seen in the city of the Lord of hosts, in the city of our God: God will establish it for ever. Selah.
- 9. We have thought of thy lovingkindness, O God, in the midst of thy temple.
- **10.** According to thy name, O God, so is thy praise unto the ends of the earth: thy right hand is full of righteousness.
- 11. Let mount Zion rejoice, let the children of Judah be glad, because of thy judgments.
- 12. Walk about Zion, and go round about it: tell the towers thereof.
- 13. Mark ye well its bulwarks, consider its palaces; that ye may tell it to the generation following.
- 14. For this God is our God for ever and ever: They will be our guide even unto death.




- 1. Hear this, all ye people; give ear, all ye inhabitants of the world:
- 2. Both low and high, rich and poor, together.
- 3. My mouth shall speak of wisdom; and the meditation of my heart shall be of understanding.
- 4. I will incline mine ear to a parable: I will open my dark saying upon the harp.
- 5. Wherefore should I fear in the days of evil, when the iniquity of my heels shall compass me about?
- 6. They that trust in their wealth, and boast themselves in the multitude of their riches;
- 7. None of them can by any means redeem their fellow, nor give to God a ransom for them:
- 8. (For the redemption of their soul is precious, and it ceaseth for ever:)
- That they should still live for ever, and not see corruption.
- **10.** For they see that sages die, likewise the fool and the brutish person perish, and leave their wealth to others.
- 11. Their inward thought is, that their houses shall continue for ever, and their dwelling places to all generations; they call their lands after their own names.
- 12. Nevertheless a mortal being in honour abideth not: they are like the beasts that perish.
- 13. This their way is their folly: yet their posterity approve their sayings. Selah.
- 14. Like sheep they are laid in the grave; death shall feed on them; and the upright shall have dominion over them in the morning; and their beauty shall consume in the grave from their dwelling.
- 15. But God will redeem my soul from the power of the grave: for They shall receive me. Selah.
- 16. Be not thou afraid when one is made rich, when the glory of their house is increased;
- 17. For when they die they shall carry nothing away: their glory shall not descend after them.
- **18.** Though while they lived they blessed their soul: and people will praise thee, when thou doest well to thyself.
- 19. They shall go to the generation of their ancestors; they shall never see light.
- 20. A mortal that is in honour, and understandeth not, is like the beasts that perish.




- 1. The mighty God, even the Lord, hath spoken, and called the earth from the rising of the sun unto the going down thereof.
- 2. Out of Zion, the perfection of beauty, God hath shined.
- 3. Our God shall come, and shall not keep silence: a fire shall devour before Them, and it shall be very tempestuous round about Them.
- 4. They shall call to the heavens from above, and to the earth, that They may judge Their people.
- 5. Gather my saints together unto me; those that have made a covenant with me by sacrifice.
- 6. And the heavens shall declare Their righteousness: for God is judge Themselves. Selah.

- 7. Hear, O my people, and I will speak; O Israel, and I will testify against thee: I am God, even thy God.
- 8. I will not reprove thee for thy sacrifices or thy burnt offerings, to have been continually before me.
- 9. I will take no bullock out of thy house, nor goats out of thy folds.
- 10. For every beast of the forest is mine, and the cattle upon a thousand hills.
- 11. I know all the fowls of the mountains: and the wild beasts of the field are mine.
- 12. If I were hungry, I would not tell thee: for the world is mine, and the fulness thereof.
- 13. Will I eat the flesh of bulls, or drink the blood of goats?
- 14. Offer unto God thanksgiving; and pay thy vows unto the most High:
- 15. And call upon me in the day of trouble: I will deliver thee, and thou shalt glorify me.
- **16.** But unto the wicked God saith, What hast thou to do to declare my statutes, or that thou shouldest take my covenant in thy mouth?
- 17. Seeing thou hatest instruction, and casteth my words behind thee.
- 18. When thou sawest a thief, then thou consentedst with them, and hast been partaker with adulterers.
- 19. Thou givest thy mouth to evil, and thy tongue frameth deceit.
- 20. Thou sittest and speakest against thy family; thou slanderest thine own parent's child.
- 21. These things hast thou done, and I kept silence; thou thoughtest that I was altogether such an one as thyself: but I will reprove thee, and set them in order before thine eyes.
- 22. Now consider this, ye that forget God, lest I tear you in pieces, and there be none to deliver.
- 23. Whoso offereth praise glorifieth me: and to them that order their conversation aright will I shew the salvation of God.




- Have mercy upon me, O God, according to thy lovingkindness: according unto the multitude of thy tender mercies blot out my transgressions.
- 2. Wash me throughly from mine iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin.
- 3. For I acknowledge my transgressions: and my sin is ever before me.
- 4. Against thee, thee only, have I sinned, and done this evil in thy sight: that thou mightest be justified when thou speakest, and be clear when thou judgest.
- 5. Behold, I was shapen in iniquity; and in sin did my mother conceive me.
- 6. Behold, thou desirest truth in the inward parts: and in the hidden part thou shalt make me to know wisdom.
- 7. Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean: wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow.
- 8. Make me to hear joy and gladness; that the bones which Thou hast broken may rejoice.
- 9. Hide Thy face from my sins, and blot out all mine iniquities.
- 10. Create in me a clean heart, O God; and renew a right spirit within me.

- 11. Cast me not away from thy presence; and take not thy holy spirit from me.
- 12. Restore unto me the joy of thy salvation; and uphold me with thy free spirit.
- 13. Then will I teach transgressors thy ways; and sinners shall be converted unto thee.
- **14.** Deliver me from bloodguiltiness, O God, thou God of my salvation: and my tongue shall sing aloud of thy righteousness.
- 15. O Lord, open thou my lips; and my mouth shall shew forth thy praise.
- 16. For thou desirest not sacrifice; else would I give it: thou delightest not in burnt offering.
- 17. The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit: a broken and a contrite heart, O God, thou wilt not despise.
- 18. Do good in thy good pleasure unto Zion: build thou the walls of Jerusalem.
- 19. Then shalt thou be pleased with the sacrifices of righteousness, with burnt offering and whole burnt offering; then shall they offer bullocks upon thine altar.




- 1. Why boastest thou thyself in mischief, O mighty warrior? the goodness of God endureth continually.
- 2. The tongue deviseth mischiefs; like a sharp razor, working deceitfully.
- 3. Thou lovest evil more than good; and lying rather than to speak righteousness. Selah.
- 4. Thou lovest all devouring words, O thou deceitful tongue.
- 5. God shall likewise destroy thee for ever, They shall take thee away, and pluck thee out of thy dwelling place, and root thee out of the land of the living. Selah.
- 6. The righteous also shall see, and fear, and shall laugh at them:
- 7. Lo, this is the person that made not God their strength; but trusted in the abundance of their riches, and strengthened themselves in their wickedness.
- 8. But I am like a green olive tree in the house of God: I trust in the mercy of God for ever and ever.
- 9. I will praise thee for ever, because thou hast done it: and I will wait on thy name; for it is good before thy saints.




- 1. The fool hath said in their heart, There is no God. Corrupt are they, and have done abominable iniquity: there is none that doeth good.
- 2. God looked down from heaven upon the children of humanity, to see if there were any that did understand, that did seek God.

- 3. Every one of them is gone back: they are altogether become filthy; there is none that doeth good, no, not one.
- 4. Have the workers of iniquity no knowledge? who eat up my people as they eat bread: they have not called upon God.
- 5. There were they in great fear, where no fear was: for God hath scattered the bones of those that encamp against thee: thou hast put them to shame, because God hath despised them.
- 6. Oh that the salvation of Israel were come out of Zion! When God bringeth back the captivity of Their people, Jacob shall rejoice, and Israel shall be glad.




- 1. Save me, O God, by thy name, and judge me by thy strength.
- 2. Hear my prayer, O God; give ear to the words of my mouth.
- 3. For strangers are risen up against me, and oppressors seek after my soul: they have not set God before them. Selah.
- 4. Behold, God is mine helper: the Lord is with them that uphold my soul.
- 5. They shall reward evil unto mine enemies: cut them off in thy truth.
- 6. I will freely sacrifice unto thee: I will praise thy name, O Lord; for it is good.
- 7. For They have delivered me out of all trouble: and mine eye hath seen Their desire upon mine enemies.



- 1. Give ear to my prayer, O God; and hide not thyself from my supplication.
- 2. Attend unto me, and hear me: I mourn in my complaint, and make a noise;
- 3. Because of the voice of the enemy, because of the oppression of the wicked: for they cast iniquity upon me, and in wrath they hate me.
- 4. My heart is sore pained within me: and the terrors of death are fallen upon me.
- 5. Fearfulness and trembling are come upon me, and horror hath overwhelmed me.
- 6. And I said, Oh that I had wings like a dove! for then would I fly away, and be at rest.
- 7. Lo, then would I wander far off, and remain in the wilderness. Selah.
- 8. I would hasten my escape from the windy storm and tempest.
- 9. Destroy, O Lord, and divide their tongues: for I have seen violence and strife in the city.

- 10. Day and night they go about it upon the walls thereof: mischief also and sorrow are in the midst of it.
- 11. Wickedness is in the midst thereof: deceit and guile depart not from the streets.
- 12. For it was not an enemy that reproached me; then I could have borne it: neither was it they that hated me that did magnify themselves against me; then I would have hid myself from them:
- 13. But it was thou, a person mine equal, my guide, and mine acquaintance.
- 14. We took sweet counsel together, and walked unto the house of God in company.
- 15. Let death seize upon them, and let them go down quick into hell: for wickedness is in their dwellings, and among them.
- 16. As for me, I will call upon God; and the Lord shall save me.
- 17. Evening, and morning, and at noon, will I pray, and cry aloud: and They shall hear my voice.
- 18. They have delivered my soul in peace from the battle that was against me: for there were many with me.
- **19.** God shall hear, and afflict them, even they that abide of old. Selah. Because they have no changes, therefore they fear not God.
- 20. They have put forth their hands against such as be at peace with them: they have broken their covenant.
- 21. The words of their mouth were smoother than butter, but war was in their heart: their words were softer than oil, yet were they drawn swords.
- 22. Cast thy burden upon the Lord, and They shall sustain thee: They shall never suffer the righteous to be moved.
- 23. But thou, O God, shalt bring them down into the pit of destruction: the bloody and deceitful shall not live out half their days; but I will trust in thee.



- 1. Be merciful unto me, O God: for my enemies would swallow me up; they fighting daily oppress me.
- 2. Mine enemies would daily swallow me up: for they be many that fight against me, O thou most High.
- 3. What time I am afraid, I will trust in thee.
- 4. In God I will praise Their Word, in God I have put my trust; I will not fear what flesh can do unto me.
- 5. Every day they wrest my words: all their thoughts are against me for evil.
- 6. They gather themselves together, they hide themselves, they mark my steps, when they wait for my soul.
- 7. Shall they escape by iniquity? in thine anger cast down the people, O God.
- 8. Thou tellest my wanderings: put thou my tears into thy bottle: are they not in thy book?
- 9. When I cry unto thee, then shall mine enemies turn back: this I know; for God is for me.
- 10. In God will I praise Their Word: in the Lord will I praise Their Word.
- 11. In God have I put my trust: I will not be afraid what mortals can do unto me.
- 12. Thy vows are upon me, O God: I will render praises unto thee.
- 13. For thou hast delivered my soul from death: wilt not thou deliver my feet from falling, that I may walk before God in the light of the living?

Psalm 57

- 1. Be merciful unto me, O God, be merciful unto me: for my soul trusteth in thee: yea, in the shadow of thy wings will I make my refuge, until these calamities be overpast.
- 2. I will cry unto God most high; unto God that performeth all things for me.
- 3. They shall send from heaven, and save me from the reproach of those that would swallow me up. Selah. God shall send forth Their mercy and Their truth.
- 4. My soul is among lions: and I lie even among them that are set on fire, people whose teeth are spears and arrows, and their tongue a sharp sword.
- 5. Be thou exalted, O God, above the heavens; let thy glory be above all the earth.
- 6. They have prepared a net for my steps; my soul is bowed down: they have digged a pit before me, into the midst whereof they are fallen themselves. Selah.
- 7. My heart is fixed, O God, my heart is fixed: I will sing and give praise.
- 8. Awake up, my glory; awake, psaltery and harp: I myself will awake early.
- 9. I will praise thee, O Lord, among the people: I will sing unto thee among the nations.
- 10. For thy mercy is great unto the heavens, and thy truth unto the clouds.
- 11. Be thou exalted, O God, above the heavens: let thy glory be above all the earth.



- Do ye indeed speak righteousness, O congregation? do ye judge uprightly, O ye people?
- 2. Yea, in heart ye work wickedness; ye weigh the violence of your hands in the earth.
- 3. The wicked are estranged from the womb: they go astray as soon as they be born, speaking lies.
- 4. Their poison is like the poison of a serpent: they are like the deaf adder that stoppeth its ear;
- 5. Which will not hearken to the voice of charmers, charming never so wisely.
- 6. Break their teeth, O God, in their mouth: break out the great teeth of the young lions, O Lord.
- 7. Let them melt away as waters which run continually: when they bend their bow to shoot their arrows, let them be as cut in pieces.
- 8. As a snail which melteth, let every one of them pass away: like the stillborn child, that they may not see the sun.
- **9.** Before your pots can feel the thorns, They shall take them away as with a whirlwind, both living, and in Their wrath.

- **10.** The righteous shall rejoice when they see the vengeance: they shall wash their feet in the blood of the wicked.
- 11. So that they shall say, Verily there is a reward for the righteous: verily They are a God that judgeth in the earth.



- 1. Deliver me from mine enemies, O my God: defend me from them that rise up against me.
- 2. Deliver me from the workers of iniquity, and save me from the bloodthirsty.
- 3. For, lo, they lie in wait for my soul: the mighty are gathered against me; not for my transgression, nor for my sin, O Lord.
- 4. They run and prepare themselves without my fault: awake to help me, and behold.
- 5. Thou therefore, O Lord God of hosts, the God of Israel, awake to visit all the heathen: be not merciful to any wicked transgressors. Selah.
- 6. They return at evening: they make a noise like a dog, and go round about the city.
- 7. Behold, they belch out with their mouth: swords are in their lips: for who, say they, doth hear?
- 8. But thou, O Lord, shalt laugh at them; thou shalt have all the heathen in derision.
- 9. Because of their strength will I wait upon thee: for God is my defence.
- 10. The God of my mercy shall prevent me: God shall let me see my desire upon mine enemies.
- 11. Slay them not, lest my people forget: scatter them by thy power; and bring them down, O Lord our shield.
- 12. For the sin of their mouth and the words of their lips let them even be taken in their pride: and for cursing and lying which they speak.
- 13. Consume them in wrath, consume them, that they may not be: and let them know that God ruleth in Jacob unto the ends of the earth. Selah.
- 14. And at evening let them return; and let them make a noise like a dog, and go round about the city.
- 15. Let them wander up and down for meat, and grudge if they be not satisfied.
- 16. But I will sing of thy power; yea, I will sing aloud of thy mercy in the morning: for thou hast been my defence and refuge in the day of my trouble.
- 17. Unto thee, O my strength, will I sing: for God is my defence, and the God of my mercy.



Psalm 60

1. O God, thou hast cast us off, thou hast scattered us, thou hast been displeased; O turn thyself to us

again.

- 2. Thou hast made the earth to tremble; thou hast broken it: heal the breaches thereof; for it shaketh.
- 3. Thou hast shewed thy people hard things: thou hast made us to drink the wine of astonishment.
- 4. Thou hast given a banner to them that fear thee, that it may be displayed because of the truth. Selah.
- 5. That thy beloved may be delivered; save with thy right hand, and hear me.
- **6.** God hath spoken in Their holiness; I will rejoice, I will divide Shechem, and mete out the valley of Succoth.
- 7. Gilead is mine, and Manasseh is mine; Ephraim also is the strength of mine head; Judah is my lawgiver;
- 8. Moab is my washpot; over Edom will I cast out my shoe: Philistia, triumph thou because of me.
- 9. Who will bring me into the strong city? who will lead me into Edom?
- 10. Wilt not thou, O God, which hadst cast us off? and thou, O God, which didst not go out with our armies?
- 11. Give us help from trouble: for vain is the help of mortals.
- 12. Through God we shall do valiantly: for it is They that shall tread down our enemies.



Psalm 61


- 1. Hear my cry, O God; attend unto my prayer.
- 2. From the end of the earth will I cry unto thee, when my heart is overwhelmed: lead me to the rock that is higher than I.
- 3. For thou hast been a shelter for me, and a strong tower from the enemy.
- 4. I will abide in thy tabernacle for ever: I will trust in the covert of thy wings. Selah.
- 5. For thou, O God, hast heard my vows: thou hast given me the heritage of those that fear thy name.
- 6. Thou wilt prolong the ruler's life: and their years as many generations.
- 7. They shall abide before God for ever: O prepare mercy and truth, which may preserve them.
- 8. So will I sing praise unto thy name for ever, that I may daily perform my vows.



- 1. Truly my soul waiteth upon God: from Them cometh my salvation.
- 2. They only are my rock and my salvation; They are my defence; I shall not be greatly moved.
- 3. How long will ye imagine mischief against this mortal? ye shall be slain all of you: as a bowing wall shall

ye be, and as a tottering fence.

- 4. They only consult to cast them down from their excellency: they delight in lies: they bless with their mouth, but they curse inwardly. Selah.
- 5. My soul, wait thou only upon God; for my expectation is from Them.
- 6. They only are my rock and my salvation: They are my defence; I shall not be moved.
- 7. In God is my salvation and my glory: the rock of my strength, and my refuge, is in God.
- 8. Trust in Them at all times; ye people, pour out your heart before Them: God is a refuge for us. Selah.
- 9. Surely those of low degree are vanity, and those of high degree are a lie: to be laid in the balance, they are altogether lighter than vanity.
- **10.** Trust not in oppression, and become not vain in robbery: if riches increase, set not your heart upon them.
- 11. God hath spoken once; twice have I heard this; that power belongeth unto God.
- 12. Also unto thee, O Lord, belongeth mercy: for thou renderest to every mortal according to their work.



Psalm 63

- O God, thou art my God; early will I seek thee: my soul thirsteth for thee, my flesh longeth for thee in a
 dry and thirsty land, where no water is;
- 2. To see thy power and thy glory, so as I have seen thee in the sanctuary.
- 3. Because thy lovingkindness is better than life, my lips shall praise thee.
- 4. Thus will I bless thee while I live: I will lift up my hands in thy name.
- 5. My soul shall be satisfied as with marrow and fatness; and my mouth shall praise thee with joyful lips:
- 6. When I remember thee upon my bed, and meditate on thee in the night watches.
- 7. Because thou hast been my help, therefore in the shadow of thy wings will I rejoice.
- 8. My soul followeth hard after thee: thy right hand upholdeth me.
- 9. But those that seek my soul, to destroy it, shall go into the lower parts of the earth.
- 10. They shall fall by the sword: they shall be a portion for foxes.
- 11. But the ruler shall rejoice in God; every one that sweareth by Them shall glory: but the mouth of them that speak lies shall be stopped.

- 1. Hear my voice, O God, in my prayer: preserve my life from fear of the enemy.
- 2. Hide me from the secret counsel of the wicked; from the insurrection of the workers of iniquity:

- 4. That they may shoot in secret at the perfect: suddenly do they shoot at them, and fear not.
- 5. They encourage themselves in an evil matter: they commune of laying snares privily; they say, Who shall see them?
- **6.** They search out iniquities; they accomplish a diligent search: both the inward thought of every one of them, and the heart, is deep.
- 7. But God shall shoot at them with an arrow; suddenly shall they be wounded.
- 8. So they shall make their own tongue to fall upon themselves: all that see them shall flee away.
- 9. And all creation shall fear, and shall declare the work of God; for they shall wisely consider of Their doing.
- 10. The righteous shall be glad in the Lord, and shall trust in Them; and all the upright in heart shall glory.


Psalm 65

- 1. Praise waiteth for thee, O God, in Sion: and unto thee shall the vow be performed.
- 2. O thou that hearest prayer, unto thee shall all flesh come.
- 3. Iniquities prevail against me: as for our transgressions, thou shalt purge them away.
- 4. Blessed is the person whom thou choosest, and causest to approach unto thee, that they may dwell in thy courts: we shall be satisfied with the goodness of thy house, even of thy holy temple.
- 5. By terrible things in righteousness wilt thou answer us, O God of our salvation; who art the confidence of all the ends of the earth, and of them that are afar off upon the sea:
- 6. Which by Their strength setteth fast the mountains; being girded with power:
- 7. Which stilleth the noise of the seas, the noise of their waves, and the tumult of the people.
- 8. They also that dwell in the uttermost parts are afraid at thy tokens: thou makest the outgoings of the morning and evening to rejoice.
- 9. Thou visitest the earth, and waterest it: thou greatly enrichest it with the river of God, which is full of water: thou preparest them corn, when thou hast so provided for it.
- **10.** Thou waterest the ridges thereof abundantly: thou settlest the furrows thereof: thou makest it soft with showers: thou blessest the springing thereof.
- 11. Thou crownest the year with thy goodness; and thy paths drop fatness.
- 12. They drop upon the pastures of the wilderness: and the little hills rejoice on every side.
- 13. The pastures are clothed with flocks; the valleys also are covered over with corn; they shout for joy, they also sing.

- 14. Which my lips have uttered, and my mouth hath spoken, when I was in trouble.
- 15. I will offer unto thee burnt sacrifices of fatlings, with the incense of rams; I will offer bullocks with goats. Selah.
- 16. Come and hear, all ye that fear God, and I will declare what They have done for my soul.
- 17. I cried unto Them with my mouth, and They were extolled with my tongue.
- 18. If I regard iniquity in my heart, the Lord will not hear me:
- 19. But verily God hath heard me; They have attended to the voice of my prayer.
- 20. Blessed be God, which hath not turned away my prayer, nor Their mercy from me.




- 1. God be merciful unto us, and bless us; and cause Their face to shine upon us; Selah.


- 1. Let God arise, let Their enemies be scattered: let them also that hate Them flee before Them.

- 4. Sing unto God, sing praises to Their name: extol Them that rideth upon the heavens by Their name Jah, and rejoice before Them.
- 5. A parent of the orphan, and a judge of the widows, is God in Their holy habitation.
- 6. God setteth the solitary in families: They bring out those which are bound with chains: but the rebellious dwell in a dry land.
- 7. O God, when thou wentest forth before thy people, when thou didst march through the wilderness; Selah:
- 8. The earth shook, the heavens also dropped at the presence of God: even Sinai itself was moved at the presence of God, the God of Israel.
- 9. Thou, O God, didst send a plentiful rain, whereby thou didst confirm thine inheritance, when it was weary.
- 10. Thy congregation hath dwelt therein: thou, O God, hast prepared of thy goodness for the poor.
- 11. The Lord gave the word: great was the company of those that published it.
- 12. Leaders of armies did flee apace: and they that tarried at home divided the spoil.
- 13. Though ye have lien among the pots, yet shall ye be as the wings of a dove covered with silver, and its feathers with yellow gold.
- 14. When the Almighty scattered rulers in it, it was white as snow in Salmon.
- 15. The hill of God is as the hill of Bashan; an high hill as the hill of Bashan.
- 16. Why leap ye, ye high hills? this is the hill which God desireth to dwell in; yea, the Lord will dwell in it for ever.
- 17. The chariots of God are twenty thousand, even thousands of angels: the Lord is among them, as in Sinai, in the holy place.
- **18.** Thou hast ascended on high, thou hast led captivity captive: thou hast received gifts for people; yea, for the rebellious also, that the Lord God might dwell among them.
- 19. Blessed be the Lord, who daily loadeth us with benefits, even the God of our salvation. Selah.
- **20.** They that are our God are the God of salvation; and unto God the Lord belong the issues from death.
- 21. But God shall wound the head of Their enemies, and the hairy scalp of such an one as goeth on still in their trespasses.
- 22. The Lord said, I will bring again from Bashan, I will bring my people again from the depths of the sea:
- 23. That thy foot may be dipped in the blood of thine enemies, and the tongue of thy dogs in the same.

- 24. They have seen thy goings, O God; even the goings of my God, my Ruler, in the sanctuary.
- **25.** The singers went before, the players on instruments followed after; among them were the children playing with timbrels.
- 26. Bless ye God in the congregations, even the Lord, from the fountain of Israel.
- 27. There is little Benjamin with their ruler, the nobles of Judah and their council, the nobles of Zebulun, and the nobles of Naphtali.
- 28. Thy God hath commanded thy strength: strengthen, O God, that which thou hast wrought for us.
- 29. Because of thy temple at Jerusalem shall rulers bring presents unto thee.
- **30.** Rebuke the company of spearmen, the multitude of the bulls, with the calves of the people, till every one submit herself with pieces of silver: scatter thou the people that delight in war.
- 31. Nobles shall come out of Egypt; Ethiopia shall soon stretch out its hands unto God.
- 32. Sing unto God, ye kingdoms of the earth; O sing praises unto the Lord; Selah:
- 33. To Them that ride upon the heavens of heavens, which were of old; lo, They do send out Their voice, and that a mighty voice.
- 34. Ascribe ye strength unto God: Their excellency is over Israel, and Their strength is in the clouds.
- **35.** O God, thou art terrible out of thy holy places: the God of Israel is They that give strength and power unto Their people. Blessed be God.




- 1. Save me, O God; for the waters are come in unto my soul.
- 2. I sink in deep mire, where there is no standing: I am come into deep waters, where the floods overflow me.
- 3. I am weary of my crying: my throat is dried: mine eyes fail while I wait for my God.
- 4. They that hate me without a cause are more than the hairs of mine head: they that would destroy me, being mine enemies wrongfully, are mighty: then I restored that which I took not away.
- 5. O God, thou knowest my foolishness; and my sins are not hid from thee.
- 6. Let not them that wait on thee, O Lord God of hosts, be ashamed for my sake: let not those that seek thee be confounded for my sake, O God of Israel.
- 7. Because for thy sake I have borne reproach; shame hath covered my face.
- 8. I am become a stranger unto my siblings, and an alien unto my family.
- 9. For the zeal of thine house hath eaten me up; and the reproaches of them that reproached thee are fallen upon me.
- 10. When I wept, and chastened my soul with fasting, that was to my reproach.
- 11. I made sackcloth also my garment; and I became a proverb to them.
- 12. They that sit in the gate speak against me; and I was the song of the drunkards.
- 13. But as for me, my prayer is unto thee, O Lord, in an acceptable time: O God, in the multitude of thy mercy hear me, in the truth of thy salvation.

- 14. Deliver me out of the mire, and let me not sink: let me be delivered from them that hate me, and out of the deep waters.
- 15. Let not the waterflood overflow me, neither let the deep swallow me up, and let not the pit shut her mouth upon me.
- **16.** Hear me, O Lord; for thy lovingkindness is good: turn unto me according to the multitude of thy tender mercies.
- 17. And hide not thy face from thy servant; for I am in trouble: hear me speedily.
- 18. Draw nigh unto my soul, and redeem it: deliver me because of mine enemies.
- 19. Thou hast known my reproach, and my shame, and my dishonour: mine adversaries are all before thee.
- 20. Reproach hath broken my heart; and I am full of heaviness: and I looked for some to take pity, but there was none; and for comforters, but I found none.
- 21. They gave me also gall for my meat; and in my thirst they gave me vinegar to drink.
- 22. Let their table become a snare before them: and that which should have been for their welfare, let it become a trap.
- 23. Let their eyes be darkened, that they see not; and make their loins continually to shake.
- 24. Pour out thine indignation upon them, and let thy wrathful anger take hold of them.
- 25. Let their habitation be desolate; and let none dwell in their tents.
- For they persecute them whom thou hast smitten; and they talk to the grief of those whom thou hast wounded.
- 27. Add iniquity unto their iniquity: and let them not come into thy righteousness.
- 28. Let them be blotted out of the book of the living, and not be written with the righteous.
- 29. But I am poor and sorrowful: let thy salvation, O God, set me up on high.
- 30. I will praise the name of God with a song, and will magnify Them with thanksgiving.
- 31. This also shall please the Lord better than an ox or bullock that hath horns and hoofs.
- 32. The humble shall see this, and be glad: and your heart shall live that seek God.
- **33.** For the Lord heareth the poor, and despiseth not Their prisoners.
- 34. Let the heaven and earth praise Them, the seas, and every thing that moveth therein.
- **35.** For God will save Zion, and will build the cities of Judah: that they may dwell there, and have it in possession.
- 36. The seed also of Their servants shall inherit it: and they that love Their name shall dwell therein.



- 1. Make haste, o God, to deliver me; make haste to help me, O Lord.
- 2. Let them be ashamed and confounded that seek after my soul: let them be turned backward, and put to confusion, that desire my hurt.
- 3. Let them be turned back for a reward of their shame that say, Aha, aha.

- 4. Let all those that seek thee rejoice and be glad in thee: and let such as love thy salvation say continually, Let God be magnified.
- 5. But I am poor and needy: make haste unto me, O God: thou art my help and my deliverer; O Lord, make no tarrying.



- 1. In thee, O Lord, do I put my trust: let me never be put to confusion.
- 2. Deliver me in thy righteousness, and cause me to escape: incline thine ear unto me, and save me.
- 3. Be thou my strong habitation, whereunto I may continually resort: thou hast given commandment to save me; for thou art my rock and my fortress.
- 4. Deliver me, O my God, out of the hand of the wicked, out of the hand of the unrighteous and cruel.
- 5. For thou art my hope, O Lord God: thou art my trust from my youth.
- 6. By thee have I been holden up from the womb: thou art They that took me out of my mother's bowels: my praise shall be continually of thee.
- 7. I am as a wonder unto many; but thou art my strong refuge.
- 8. Let my mouth be filled with thy praise and with thy honour all the day.
- 9. Cast me not off in the time of old age; forsake me not when my strength faileth.
- 10. For mine enemies speak against me; and they that lay wait for my soul take counsel together,
- 11. Saying, God hath forsaken them: persecute and take them; for there is none to deliver them.
- 12. O God, be not far from me: O my God, make haste for my help.
- 13. Let them be confounded and consumed that are adversaries to my soul; let them be covered with reproach and dishonour that seek my hurt.
- 14. But I will hope continually, and will yet praise thee more and more.
- 15. My mouth shall shew forth thy righteousness and thy salvation all the day; for I know not the numbers thereof.
- 16. I will go in the strength of the Lord God: I will make mention of thy righteousness, even of thine only.
- 17. O God, thou hast taught me from my youth: and hitherto have I declared thy wondrous works.
- **18.** Now also when I am old and greyheaded, O God, forsake me not; until I have shewed thy strength unto this generation, and thy power to every one that is to come.
- 19. Thy righteousness also, O God, is very high, who hast done great things: O God, who is like unto thee!
- **20.** Thou, which hast shewed me great and sore troubles, shalt quicken me again, and shalt bring me up again from the depths of the earth.
- 21. Thou shalt increase my greatness, and comfort me on every side.
- 22. I will also praise thee with the psaltery, even thy truth, O my God: unto thee will I sing with the harp, O thou Holy One of Israel.
- 23. My lips shall greatly rejoice when I sing unto thee; and my soul, which thou hast redeemed.
- 24. My tongue also shall talk of thy righteousness all the day long: for they are confounded, for they are

Psalm 72

- 1. Give the ruler thy judgments, O God, and thy righteousness unto the ruler's descendant.
- 2. They shall judge thy people with righteousness, and thy poor with judgment.
- 3. The mountains shall bring peace to the people, and the little hills, by righteousness.
- 4. They shall judge the poor of the people, they shall save the children of the needy, and shall break in pieces the oppressor.
- 5. They shall fear thee as long as the sun and moon endure, throughout all generations.
- 6. They shall come down like rain upon the mown grass: as showers that water the earth.
- 7. In their days shall the righteous flourish; and abundance of peace so long as the moon endureth.
- 8. They shall have dominion also from sea to sea, and from the river unto the ends of the earth.
- 9. They that dwell in the wilderness shall bow before them; and their enemies shall lick the dust.
- 10. The rulers of Tarshish and of the isles shall bring presents: the rulers of Sheba and Seba shall offer gifts.
- 11. Yea, all rulers shall fall down before them: all nations shall serve them.
- 12. For they shall deliver the needy when they cry; the poor also, and them that have no helper.
- 13. They shall spare the poor and needy, and shall save the souls of the needy.
- 14. They shall redeem their soul from deceit and violence: and precious shall their blood be in their sight.
- 15. And they shall live, and to them shall be given of the gold of Sheba: prayer also shall be made for them continually; and daily shall they be praised.
- **16.** There shall be an handful of corn in the earth upon the top of the mountains; the fruit thereof shall shake like Lebanon: and they of the city shall flourish like grass of the earth.
- 17. Their name shall endure for ever: their name shall be continued as long as the sun: and the people shall be blessed in them: all nations shall call her blessed.
- 18. Blessed be the Lord God, the God of Israel, who only doeth wondrous things.
- 19. And blessed be Their glorious name for ever: and let the whole earth be filled with Their glory; Amen, and Amen.
- 20. The prayers of David the begotten of Jesse are ended.



- 1. Truly God is good to Israel, even to such as are of a clean heart.
- 2. But as for me, my feet were almost gone; my steps had well nigh slipped.
- 3. For I was envious at the foolish, when I saw the prosperity of the wicked.
- 4. For there are no bands in their death: but their strength is firm.
- 5. They are not in trouble as other people; neither are they plagued like other people.
- 6. Therefore pride compasseth them about as a chain; violence covereth them as a garment.
- 7. Their eyes stand out with fatness: they have more than heart could wish.
- 8. They are corrupt, and speak wickedly concerning oppression: they speak loftily.
- 9. They set their mouth against the heavens, and their tongue walketh through the earth.
- 10. Therefore their people return hither: and waters of a full cup are wrung out to them.
- 11. And they say, How doth God know? and is there knowledge in the most High?
- 12. Behold, these are the ungodly, who prosper in the world; they increase in riches.
- 13. Verily I have cleansed my heart in vain, and washed my hands in innocency.
- 14. For all the day long have I been plagued, and chastened every morning.
- 15. If I say, I will speak thus; behold, I should offend against the generation of thy children.
- 16. When I thought to know this, it was too painful for me;
- 17. Until I went into the sanctuary of God; then understood I their end.
- 18. Surely thou didst set them in slippery places: thou castedst them down into destruction.
- 19. How are they brought into desolation, as in a moment! they are utterly consumed with terrors.
- 20. As a dream when one awaketh; so, O Lord, when thou awakest, thou shalt despise their image.
- 21. Thus my heart was grieved, and I was pricked in my reins.
- 22. So foolish was I, and ignorant: I was as a beast before thee.
- 23. Nevertheless I am continually with thee: thou hast holden me by my right hand.
- 24. Thou shalt guide me with thy counsel, and afterward receive me to glory.
- 25. Whom have I in heaven but thee? and there is none upon earth that I desire beside thee.
- 26. My flesh and my heart faileth: but God is the strength of my heart, and my portion for ever.
- 27. For, lo, they that are far from thee shall perish: thou hast destroyed all them that go a whoring from thee.
- 28. But it is good for me to draw near to God: I have put my trust in the Lord God, that I may declare all thy works.




- 1. O God, why hast thou cast us off for ever? why doth thine anger smoke against the sheep of thy pasture?
- 2. Remember thy congregation, which thou hast purchased of old; the rod of thine inheritance, which thou hast redeemed; this mount Zion, wherein thou hast dwelt.

- 3. Lift up thy feet unto the perpetual desolations; even all that the enemy hath done wickedly in the sanctuary.
- 4. Thine enemies roar in the midst of thy congregations; they set up their ensigns for signs.
- 5. A person was famous according as they had lifted up axes upon the thick trees.
- 6. But now they break down the carved work thereof at once with axes and hammers.
- 7. They have cast fire into thy sanctuary, they have defiled by casting down the dwelling place of thy name to the ground.
- 8. They said in their hearts, Let us destroy them together: they have burned up all the synagogues of God in the land.
- 9. We see not our signs: there is no more any prophet: neither is there among us any that knoweth how long.
- 10. O God, how long shall the adversary reproach? shall the enemy blaspheme thy name for ever?
- 11. Why withdrawest thou thy hand, even thy right hand? pluck it out of thy bosom.
- 12. For God is my Ruler of old, working salvation in the midst of the earth.
- 13. Thou didst divide the sea by thy strength: thou brakest the heads of the dragons in the waters.
- 14. Thou brakest the heads of leviathan in pieces, and gavest them to be meat to the people inhabiting the wilderness.
- 15. Thou didst cleave the fountain and the flood: thou driedst up mighty rivers.
- 16. The day is thine, the night also is thine: thou hast prepared the light and the sun.
- 17. Thou hast set all the borders of the earth; thou hast made summer and winter.
- **18.** Remember this, that the enemy hath reproached, O Lord, and that the foolish people have blasphemed thy name.
- 19. O deliver not the soul of thy turtledove unto the multitude of the wicked: forget not the congregation of thy poor for ever.
- 20. Have respect unto the covenant: for the dark places of the earth are full of the habitations of cruelty.
- 21. O let not the oppressed return ashamed: let the poor and needy praise thy name.
- 22. Arise, O God, plead thine own cause: remember how the foolish mortal reproacheth thee daily.
- 23. Forget not the voice of thine enemies: the tumult of those that rise up against thee increaseth continually.




- 1. Unto thee, O God, do we give thanks, unto thee do we give thanks: for that thy name is near thy wondrous works declare.
- 2. When I shall receive the congregation I will judge uprightly.
- 3. The earth and all the inhabitants thereof are dissolved: I bear up the pillars of it. Selah.
- 4. I said unto the fools, Deal not foolishly: and to the wicked, Lift not up the horn:
- 5. Lift not up your horn on high: speak not with a stiff neck.

- 6. For promotion cometh neither from the east, nor from the west, nor from the south.
- 7. But God is the judge: They put down one, and set up another.
- 8. For in the hand of the Lord there is a cup, and the wine is red; it is full of mixture; and They pour out of the same: but the dregs thereof, all the wicked of the earth shall wring them out, and drink them.
- 9. But I will declare for ever; I will sing praises to the God of Jacob.
- **10.** All the horns of the wicked also will I cut off; but the horns of the righteous shall be exalted.



- 1. In Judah is God known: Their name is great in Israel.
- 2. In Salem also is Their tabernacle, and Their dwelling place in Zion.
- 3. There brake They the arrows of the bow, the shield, and the sword, and the battle. Selah.
- 4. Thou art more glorious and excellent than the mountains of prey.
- 5. The stouthearted are spoiled, they have slept their sleep: and none of the warriors have found their hands.
- 6. At thy rebuke, O God of Jacob, both the chariot and horse are cast into a dead sleep.
- 7. Thou, even thou, art to be feared: and who may stand in thy sight when once thou art angry?
- 8. Thou didst cause judgment to be heard from heaven; the earth feared, and was still,
- 9. When God arose to judgment, to save all the meek of the earth. Selah.
- 10. Surely the wrath of mortals shall praise thee: the remainder of wrath shalt thou restrain.
- 11. Vow, and pay unto the Lord your God: let all that be round about Them bring presents unto Them that ought to be feared.
- 12. They shall cut off the spirit of nobles: They are terrible to the rulers of the earth.



- 1. I cried unto God with my voice, even unto God with my voice; and They gave ear unto me.
- 2. In the day of my trouble I sought the Lord: my sore ran in the night, and ceased not: my soul refused to be comforted.
- 3. I remembered God, and was troubled: I complained, and my spirit was overwhelmed. Selah.
- 4. Thou holdest mine eyes waking: I am so troubled that I cannot speak.

- 5. I have considered the days of old, the years of ancient times.
- I call to remembrance my song in the night: I commune with mine own heart: and my spirit made diligent search.
- 7. Will the Lord cast off for ever? and will They be favourable no more?
- 8. Is Their mercy clean gone for ever? doth Their promise fail for evermore?
- **9.** Hath God forgotten to be gracious? have They in anger shut up Their tender mercies? Selah.
- 10. And I said, This is my infirmity: but I will remember the years of the right hand of the most High.
- 11. I will remember the works of the Lord: surely I will remember thy wonders of old.
- 12. I will meditate also of all thy work, and talk of thy doings.
- 13. Thy way, O God, is in the sanctuary: who is so great a God as our God?
- 14. Thou art the God that doest wonders: thou hast declared thy strength among the people.
- 15. Thou hast with thine arm redeemed thy people, the descendents of Jacob and Joseph. Selah.
- 16. The waters saw thee, O God, the waters saw thee; they were afraid: the depths also were troubled.
- 17. The clouds poured out water: the skies sent out a sound: thine arrows also went abroad.
- 18. The voice of thy thunder was in the heaven: the lightnings lightened the world: the earth trembled and shook.
- 19. Thy way is in the sea, and thy path in the great waters, and thy footsteps are not known.
- 20. Thou leddest thy people like a flock by the hand of Moses and Aaron.



- 1. Give ear, O my people, to my law: incline your ears to the words of my mouth.
- 2. I will open my mouth in a parable: I will utter dark sayings of old:
- 3. Which we have heard and known, and our ancestors have told us.
- 4. We will not hide them from their children, shewing to the generation to come the praises of the Lord, and Their strength, and Their wonderful works that They have done.
- 5. For They established a testimony in Jacob, and appointed a law in Israel, which They commanded our ancestors, that they should make them known to their children:
- 6. That the generation to come might know them, even the children which should be born; who should arise and declare them to their children:
- 7. That they might set their hope in God, and not forget the works of God, but keep Their commandments:
- 8. And might not be as their ancestors, a stubborn and rebellious generation; a generation that set not their heart aright, and whose spirit was not stedfast with God.
- 9. The children of Ephraim, being armed, and carrying bows, turned back in the day of battle.
- 10. They kept not the covenant of God, and refused to walk in Their law;
- 11. And forgat Their works, and Their wonders that They had shewed them.

- 12. Marvellous things did They in the sight of their ancestors, in the land of Egypt, in the field of Zoan.
- 13. They divided the sea, and caused them to pass through; and They made the waters to stand as an heap.
- 14. In the daytime also They led them with a cloud, and all the night with a light of fire.
- 15. They clave the rocks in the wilderness, and gave them drink as out of the great depths.
- They brought streams also out of the rock, and caused waters to run down like rivers.
- 17. And they sinned yet more against Them by provoking the most High in the wilderness.
- 18. And they tempted God in their heart by asking meat for their lust.
- 19. Yea, they spake against God; they said, Can God furnish a table in the wilderness?
- 20. Behold, They smote the rock, that the waters gushed out, and the streams overflowed; can They give bread also? can They provide flesh for Their people?
- 21. Therefore the Lord heard this, and was wroth: so a fire was kindled against Jacob, and anger also came up against Israel;
- **22.** Because they believed not in God, and trusted not in Their salvation:
- 23. Though They had commanded the clouds from above, and opened the doors of heaven,
- 24. And had rained down manna upon them to eat, and had given them of the corn of heaven.
- 25. The people did eat angels' food: They sent them meat to the full.
- 26. They caused an east wind to blow in the heaven: and by Their power They brought in the south wind.
- 27. They rained flesh also upon them as dust, and feathered fowls like as the sand of the sea:
- 28. And They let it fall in the midst of their camp, round about their habitations.
- 29. So they did eat, and were well filled: for They gave them their own desire;
- 30. They were not estranged from their lust. But while their meat was yet in their mouths,
- 31. The wrath of God came upon them, and slew the fattest of them, and smote down the chosen people of Israel.
- 32. For all this they sinned still, and believed not for Their wondrous works.
- 33. Therefore their days did They consume in vanity, and their years in trouble.
- 34. When They slew them, then they sought Them: and they returned and enquired early after God.
- 35. And they remembered that God was their rock, and the high God their redeemer.
- 36. Nevertheless they did flatter Them with their mouth, and they lied unto Them with their tongues.
- 37. For their heart was not right with Them, neither were they stedfast in Their covenant.
- **38.** But They, being full of compassion, forgave their iniquity, and destroyed them not: yea, many a time turned They Their anger away, and did not stir up all Their wrath.
- 39. For They remembered that they were but flesh; a wind that passeth away, and cometh not again.
- 40. How oft did they provoke Them in the wilderness, and grieve Them in the desert!
- 41. Yea, they turned back and tempted God, and limited the Holy One of Israel.
- 42. They remembered not Their hand, nor the day when They delivered them from the enemy.
- 43. How They had wrought Their signs in Egypt, and Their wonders in the field of Zoan.
- 44. And had turned their rivers into blood; and their floods, that they could not drink.
- 45. They sent divers sorts of flies among them, which devoured them; and frogs, which destroyed them.
- 46. They gave also their increase unto the caterpiller, and their labour unto the locust.
- 47. They destroyed their vines with hail, and their sycomore trees with frost.

- 48. They gave up their cattle also to the hail, and their flocks to hot thunderbolts.
- **49.** They cast upon them the fierceness of Their anger, wrath, and indignation, and trouble, by sending evil angels among them.
- **50.** They made a way to Their anger; They spared not their soul from death, but gave their life over to the pestilence;
- 51. And smote all the firstborn in Egypt; the chief of their strength in the tabernacles of Ham:
- 52. But made Their own people to go forth like sheep, and guided them in the wilderness like a flock.
- 53. And They led them on safely, so that they feared not: but the sea overwhelmed their enemies.
- **54.** And They brought them to the border of Their sanctuary, even to this mountain, which Their right hand had purchased.
- 55. They cast out the heathen also before them, and divided them an inheritance by line, and made the tribes of Israel to dwell in their tents.
- 56. Yet they tempted and provoked the most high God, and kept not Their testimonies:
- 57. But turned back, and dealt unfaithfully like their ancestors: they were turned aside like a deceitful bow.
- 58. For they provoked Their to anger with their high places, and moved Their to jealousy with their graven images.
- **59.** When God heard this, They were wroth, and greatly abhorred Israel:
- 60. So that They forsook the tabernacle of Shiloh, the tent which he placed among Their people;
- 61. And delivered Their strength into captivity, and Their glory into the enemy's hand.
- 62. They gave Their people over also unto the sword; and was wroth with Their inheritance.
- 63. The fire consumed their warriors; and their youth were not given to marriage.
- 64. Their priests fell by the sword; and their widows made no lamentation.
- 65. Then the Lord awaked as one out of sleep, and like a warrior that shouteth by reason of wine.
- 66. And They smote Their enemies in the hinder parts: They put them to a perpetual reproach.
- 67. Moreover They refused the tabernacle of Joseph, and chose not the tribe of Ephraim:
- 68. But chose the tribe of Judah, the mount Zion which They loved.
- 69. And They built Their sanctuary like high palaces, like the earth which They have established for ever.
- 70. He chose David also Their servant, and took him from the sheepfolds:
- 71. From following the ewes great with young They brought him to feed Jacob his people, and Israel his inheritance.
- 72. So he fed them according to the integrity of his heart; and guided them by the skilfulness of his hands.




- 1. O god, the heathen are come into thine inheritance; thy holy temple have they defiled; they have laid Jerusalem on heaps.
- 2. The dead bodies of thy servants have they given to be meat unto the fowls of the heaven, the flesh of thy

- saints unto the beasts of the earth.
- 3. Their blood have they shed like water round about Jerusalem; and there was none to bury them.
- 4. We are become a reproach to our neighbours, a scorn and derision to them that are round about us.
- 5. How long, Lord? wilt thou be angry for ever? shall thy jealousy burn like fire?
- 6. Pour out thy wrath upon the heathen that have not known thee, and upon the kingdoms that have not called upon thy name.
- 7. For they have devoured our ancestors, and laid waste their dwelling place.
- 8. O remember not against us former iniquities: let thy tender mercies speedily prevent us: for we are brought very low.
- 9. Help us, O God of our salvation, for the glory of thy name: and deliver us, and purge away our sins, for thy name's sake.
- 10. Wherefore should the heathen say, Where is their God? let Them be known among the heathen in our sight by the revenging of the blood of thy servants which is shed.
- 11. Let the sighing of the prisoner come before thee; according to the greatness of thy power preserve thou those that are appointed to die;
- 12. And render unto our neighbours sevenfold into their bosom their reproach, wherewith they have reproached thee, O Lord.
- 13. So we thy people and sheep of thy pasture will give thee thanks for ever: we will shew forth thy praise to all generations.




- 1. Give ear, O Shepherd of Israel, thou that leadest Joseph like a flock; thou that dwellest between the cherubims, shine forth.
- 2. Before Ephraim and Benjamin and Manasseh stir up thy strength, and come and save us.
- 3. Turn us again, O God, and cause thy face to shine; and we shall be saved.
- 4. O Lord God of hosts, how long wilt thou be angry against the prayer of thy people?
- 5. Thou feedest them with the bread of tears; and givest them tears to drink in great measure.
- 6. Thou makest us a strife unto our neighbours: and our enemies laugh among themselves.
- 7. Turn us again, O God of hosts, and cause thy face to shine; and we shall be saved.
- 8. Thou hast brought a vine out of Egypt: thou hast cast out the heathen, and planted it.
- 9. Thou preparedst room before it, and didst cause it to take deep root, and it filled the land.
- 10. The hills were covered with the shadow of it, and the boughs thereof were like the goodly cedars.
- 11. It sent out it boughs unto the sea, and its branches unto the river.
- 12. Why hast thou then broken down its hedges, so that all they which pass by the way do pluck it?
- 13. The boar out of the wood doth waste it, and the wild beast of the field doth devour it.
- 14. Return, we beseech thee, O God of hosts: look down from heaven, and behold, and visit this vine;

- 15. And the vineyard which thy right hand hath planted, and the branch that thou madest strong for thyself.
- 16. It is burned with fire, it is cut down: they perish at the rebuke of thy countenance.
- 17. Let thy hand be upon the person of thy right hand, upon the person whom thou madest strong for thyself.
- 18. So will not we go back from thee: quicken us, and we will call upon thy name.
- 19. Turn us again, O Lord God of hosts, cause thy face to shine; and we shall be saved.



- 1. Sing aloud unto God our strength: make a joyful noise unto the God of Jacob.
- 2. Take a psalm, and bring hither the timbrel, the pleasant harp with the psaltery.
- 3. Blow up the trumpet in the new moon, in the time appointed, on our solemn feast day.
- 4. For this was a statute for Israel, and a law of the God of Jacob.
- 5. This They ordained in Joseph for a testimony, when They went out through the land of Egypt: where I heard a language that I understood not.
- 6. I removed their shoulder from the burden: their hands were delivered from the pots.
- 7. Thou calledst in trouble, and I delivered thee; I answered thee in the secret place of thunder: I proved thee at the waters of Meribah. Selah.
- 8. Hear, O my people, and I will testify unto thee: O Israel, if thou wilt hearken unto me;
- 9. There shall no strange god be in thee; neither shalt thou worship any strange god.
- 10. I am the Lord thy God, which brought thee out of the land of Egypt: open thy mouth wide, and I will fill it.
- But my people would not hearken to my voice; and Israel would none of me.
- 12. So I gave them up unto their own hearts' lust: and they walked in their own counsels.
- 13. Oh that my people had hearkened unto me, and Israel had walked in my ways!
- 14. I should soon have subdued their enemies, and turned my hand against their adversaries.
- 15. The haters of the Lord should have submitted themselves unto Them: but their time should have endured for ever.
- 16. They should have fed them also with the finest of the wheat: and with honey out of the rock should I have satisfied thee.



- 1. God standeth in the congregation of the mighty; They judge among the gods.
- 2. How long will ye judge unjustly, and accept the persons of the wicked? Selah.
- 3. Defend the poor and motherless: do justice to the afflicted and needy.
- 4. Deliver the poor and needy: rid them out of the hand of the wicked.
- 5. They know not, neither will they understand; they walk on in darkness: all the foundations of the earth are out of course.
- 6. I have said, Ye are gods; and all of you are children of the most High.
- 7. But ye shall die like mortals, and fall like one of the earthly rulers.
- 8. Arise, O God, judge the earth: for thou shalt inherit all nations.

Psalm 83

- 1. Keep not thou silence, O God: hold not thy peace, and be not still, O God.
- 2. For, lo, thine enemies make a tumult: and they that hate thee have lifted up the head.
- 3. They have taken crafty counsel against thy people, and consulted against thy hidden ones.
- 4. They have said, Come, and let us cut them off from being a nation; that the name of Israel may be no more in remembrance.
- 5. For they have consulted together with one consent: they are confederate against thee:
- 6. The tabernacles of Edom, and the Ishmaelites; of Moab, and the Hagarenes;
- 7. Gebal, and Ammon, and Amalek; the Philistines with the inhabitants of Tyre;
- 8. Assur also is joined with them: they have holpen the children of Lot. Selah.
- 9. Do unto them as unto the Midianites; as to Sisera, as to Jabin, at the brook of Kison:
- **10.** Which perished at Endor: they became as dung for the earth.
- 11. Make their nobles like Oreb, and like Zeeb: yea, all their rulers as Zebah, and as Zalmunna:
- 12. Who said, Let us take to ourselves the houses of God in possession.
- 13. O my God, make them like a wheel; as the stubble before the wind.
- 14. As the fire burneth a wood, and as the flame setteth the mountains on fire;
- 15. So persecute them with thy tempest, and make them afraid with thy storm.
- 16. Fill their faces with shame; that they may seek thy name, O Lord.
- 17. Let them be confounded and troubled for ever; yea, let them be put to shame, and perish:
- 18. That all people may know that thou, whose name alone is Jehovah, art the most high over all the earth.

- 1. How amiable are thy tabernacles, O Lord of hosts!
- 2. My soul longeth, yea, even fainteth for the courts of the Lord: my heart and my flesh crieth out for the living God.
- 3. Yea, the sparrow hath found an house, and the swallow a nest for herself, where she may lay her young, even thine altars, O Lord of hosts, my Ruler, and my God.
- 4. Blessed are they that dwell in thy house: they will be still praising thee. Selah.
- 5. Blessed is the person whose strength is in thee; in whose heart are the ways of them.
- 6. Who passing through the valley of Baca make it a well; the rain also filleth the pools.
- 7. They go from strength to strength, every one of them in Zion appeareth before God.
- 8. O Lord God of hosts, hear my prayer: give ear, O God of Jacob. Selah.
- 9. Behold, O God our shield, and look upon the face of thine anointed.
- **10.** For a day in thy courts is better than a thousand. I had rather be a doorkeeper in the house of my God, than to dwell in the tents of wickedness.
- 11. For the Lord God is a sun and shield: the Lord will give grace and glory: no good thing will They withhold from them that walk uprightly.
- 12. O Lord of hosts, blessed is the person that trusteth in thee.




- 1. Lord, thou hast been favourable unto thy land: thou hast brought back the captivity of Jacob.
- Thou hast forgiven the iniquity of thy people, thou hast covered all their sin. Selah.
- 3. Thou hast taken away all thy wrath: thou hast turned thyself from the fierceness of thine anger.
- 4. Turn us, O God of our salvation, and cause thine anger toward us to cease.
- 5. Wilt thou be angry with us for ever? wilt thou draw out thine anger to all generations?
- 6. Wilt thou not revive us again: that thy people may rejoice in thee?
- 7. Shew us thy mercy, O Lord, and grant us thy salvation.
- 8. I will hear what God the Lord will speak: for They will speak peace unto Their people, and to Their saints: but let them not turn again to folly.

- 10. Mercy and truth are met together; righteousness and peace have kissed each other.

- **15.** But thou, O Lord, art a God full of compassion, and gracious, long suffering, and plenteous in mercy and truth.
- **16.** O turn unto me, and have mercy upon me; give thy strength unto thy servant, and save the seed of thy servant.
- 17. Shew me a token for good; that they which hate me may see it, and be ashamed: because thou, Lord, hast holpen me, and comforted me.



- 1. Their foundation is in the holy mountains.
- 2. The Lord loveth the gates of Zion more than all the dwellings of Jacob.
- 3. Glorious things are spoken of thee, O city of God. Selah.

- 4. I will make mention of Rahab and Babylon to them that know me: behold Philistia, and Tyre, with Ethiopia; this person was born there.
- 5. And of Zion it shall be said, This and that person was born there: and the highest Themself shall establish it
- 6. The Lord shall count, when They write up the people, that this person was born there. Selah.
- 7. As well the singers as the players on instruments shall be there: all my springs are in thee.




- 1. O lord God of my salvation, I have cried day and night before thee:

- **16.** Thy fierce wrath goeth over me; thy terrors have cut me off.
- 17. They came round about me daily like water; they compassed me about together.
- 18. Lover and friend hast thou put far from me, and mine acquaintance into darkness.

- 4. Thy seed will I establish for ever, and build up thy throne to all generations. Selah.
- 5. And the heavens shall praise thy wonders, O Lord: thy faithfulness also in the congregation of the saints.
- 6. For who in the heaven can be compared unto the Lord? who among the descendants of the mighty can be likened unto the Lord?
- 7. God is greatly to be feared in the assembly of the saints, and to be had in reverence of all them that are about Them.
- 8. O Lord God of hosts, who is a strong Lord like unto thee? or to thy faithfulness round about thee?
- 9. Thou rulest the raging of the sea: when the waves thereof arise, thou stillest them.
- 10. Thou hast broken Rahab in pieces, as one that is slain; thou hast scattered thine enemies with thy strong arm.
- 11. The heavens are thine, the earth also is thine: as for the world and the fulness thereof, thou hast founded them.
- 12. The north and the south thou hast created them: Tabor and Hermon shall rejoice in thy name.
- 13. Thou hast a mighty arm: strong is thy hand, and high is thy right hand.
- 14. Justice and judgment are the habitation of thy throne: mercy and truth shall go before thy face.
- 15. Blessed is the people that know the joyful sound: they shall walk, O Lord, in the light of thy countenance.
- 16. In thy name shall they rejoice all the day: and in thy righteousness shall they be exalted.
- 17. For thou art the glory of their strength: and in thy favour our horn shall be exalted.
- 18. For the Lord is our defence; and the Holy One of Israel is our Ruler.
- 19. Then thou spakest in vision to thy holy one, and saidst, I have laid help upon one that is mighty; I have exalted one chosen out of the people.
- **20.** I have found my servant; with my holy oil have I anointed them:
- 21. With whom my hand shall be established: mine arm also shall strengthen them.
- 22. The enemy shall not exact upon them; nor the children of wickedness afflict them.
- 23. And I will beat down their foes before their face, and plague them that hate them.
- 24. But my faithfulness and my mercy shall be with them: and in my name shall their horn be exalted.
- 25. I will set their hand also in the sea, and their right hand in the rivers.
- 26. They shall cry unto me, Thou art my parent, my God, and the rock of my salvation.
- 27. Also I will make them my firstborn, higher than the rulers of the earth.
- 28. My mercy will I keep for them for evermore, and my covenant shall stand fast with them.
- 29. Their seed also will I make to endure for ever, and their throne as the days of heaven.
- 30. If their children forsake my law, and walk not in my judgments;
- 31. If they break my statutes, and keep not my commandments;
- 32. Then will I visit their transgression with the rod, and their iniquity with stripes.
- 33. Nevertheless my lovingkindness will I not utterly take from my servant, nor suffer my faithfulness to fail.

- 34. My covenant will I not break, nor alter the thing that is gone out of my lips.
- 35. Once have I sworn by my holiness that I will not lie unto my servant.
- 36. Their seed shall endure for ever, and their throne as the sun before me.
- 37. It shall be established for ever as the moon, and as a faithful witness in heaven. Selah.
- 38. But thou hast cast off and abhorred, thou hast been wroth with thine anointed.
- **39.** Thou hast made void the covenant of thy servant: thou hast profaned their crown by casting it to the ground.
- 40. Thou hast broken down all their hedges; thou hast brought their strong holds to ruin.
- 41. All that pass by the way spoil them: they are a reproach to their neighbours.
- 42. Thou hast set up the right hand of their adversaries; thou hast made all their enemies to rejoice.
- 43. Thou hast also turned the edge of their sword, and hast not made them to stand in the battle.
- 44. Thou hast made their glory to cease, and cast their throne down to the ground.
- 45. The days of their youth hast thou shortened: thou hast covered them with shame. Selah.
- 46. How long, Lord? wilt thou hide thyself for ever? shall thy wrath burn like fire?
- 47. Remember how short my time is: wherefore hast thou made all humanity in vain?
- **48.** What mortal are they that live, and shall not see death? shall they deliver their soul from the hand of the grave? Selah.
- 49. Lord, where are thy former lovingkindnesses, which thou swarest unto thy servant in thy truth?
- **50.** Remember, Lord, the reproach of thy servants; how I do bear in my bosom the reproach of all the mighty people;
- 51. Wherewith thine enemies have reproached, O Lord; wherewith they have reproached the footsteps of thine anointed.
- **52.** Blessed be the Lord for evermore. Amen, and Amen.



- 1. Lord, thou hast been our dwelling place in all generations.
- 2. Before the mountains were brought forth, or ever thou hadst formed the earth and the world, even from everlasting to everlasting, thou art God.
- 3. Thou turnest mortals to destruction; and sayest, Return, ye children of mortals.
- 4. For a thousand years in thy sight are but as yesterday when it is past, and as a watch in the night.
- 5. Thou carriest them away as with a flood; they are as a sleep: in the morning they are like grass which groweth up.
- 6. In the morning it flourisheth, and groweth up; in the evening it is cut down, and withereth.
- 7. For we are consumed by thine anger, and by thy wrath are we troubled.
- 8. Thou hast set our iniquities before thee, our secret sins in the light of thy countenance.

- 9. For all our days are passed away in thy wrath: we spend our years as a tale that is told.
- 10. The days of our years are threescore years and ten; and if by reason of strength they be fourscore years, yet is their strength labour and sorrow; for it is soon cut off, and we fly away.
- 11. Who knoweth the power of thine anger? even according to thy fear, so is thy wrath.
- 12. So teach us to number our days, that we may apply our hearts unto wisdom.
- 13. Return, O Lord, how long? and let it repent thee concerning thy servants.
- 14. O satisfy us early with thy mercy; that we may rejoice and be glad all our days.
- 15. Make us glad according to the days wherein thou hast afflicted us, and the years wherein we have seen evil.
- 16. Let thy work appear unto thy servants, and thy glory unto their children.
- 17. And let the beauty of the Lord our God be upon us: and establish thou the work of our hands upon us; yea, the work of our hands establish thou it.


Psalm 91

- 1. They that dwell in the secret place of the most High shall abide under the shadow of the Almighty.
- 2. I will say of the Lord, They are my refuge and my fortress: my God; in Them will I trust.
- 3. Surely They shall deliver thee from the snare of the fowler, and from the noisome pestilence.
- 4. They shall cover thee with Their feathers, and under Their wings shalt thou trust: Their truth shall be thy shield and buckler.
- 5. Thou shalt not be afraid for the terror by night; nor for the arrow that flieth by day;
- 6. Nor for the pestilence that walketh in darkness; nor for the destruction that wasteth at noonday.
- 7. A thousand shall fall at thy side, and ten thousand at thy right hand; but it shall not come nigh thee.
- 8. Only with thine eyes shalt thou behold and see the reward of the wicked.
- 9. Because thou hast made the Lord, which is my refuge, even the most High, thy habitation;
- There shall no evil befall thee, neither shall any plague come nigh thy dwelling.
- 11. For They shall give Their angels charge over thee, to keep thee in all thy ways.
- 12. They shall bear thee up in their hands, lest thou dash thy foot against a stone.
- 13. Thou shalt tread upon the lion and adder: the young lion and the dragon shalt thou trample under feet.
- 14. Because they have set their love upon me, therefore will I deliver them: I will set them on high, because they have known my name.
- 15. They shall call upon me, and I will answer them: I will be with them in trouble; I will deliver them, and honour them.
- **16.** With long life will I satisfy them, and shew them my salvation.

- 1. It is a good thing to give thanks unto the Lord, and to sing praises unto thy name, O Most High:
- 2. To shew forth thy lovingkindness in the morning, and thy faithfulness every night,

- 4. For thou, Lord, hast made me glad through thy work: I will triumph in the works of thy hands.
- 5. O Lord, how great are thy works! and thy thoughts are very deep.
- 6. A brutish person knoweth not; neither doth a fool understand this.
- 7. When the wicked spring as the grass, and when all the workers of iniquity do flourish; it is that they shall be destroyed for ever:
- 8. But thou, Lord, art most high for evermore.
- 9. For, lo, thine enemies, O Lord, for, lo, thine enemies shall perish; all the workers of iniquity shall be scattered.
- 10. But my horn shalt thou exalt like the horn of an unicorn: I shall be anointed with fresh oil.
- 11. Mine eye also shall see my desire on mine enemies, and mine ears shall hear my desire of the wicked that rise up against me.
- 12. The righteous shall flourish like the palm tree: they shall grow like a cedar in Lebanon.
- 13. Those that be planted in the house of the Lord shall flourish in the courts of our God.
- 14. They shall still bring forth fruit in old age; they shall be fat and flourishing;
- 15. To shew that the Lord is upright: they are my rock, and there is no unrighteousness in them.



Psalm 93

- 1. The Lord reigneth, They are clothed with majesty; the Lord is clothed with strength, wherewith They have girded Themselves: the world also is stablished, that it cannot be moved.
- 2. Thy throne is established of old: thou art from everlasting.
- 3. The floods have lifted up, O Lord, the floods have lifted up their voice; the floods lift up their waves.
- 4. The Lord on high is mightier than the noise of many waters, yea, than the mighty waves of the sea.
- 5. Thy testimonies are very sure: holiness becometh thine house, O Lord, for ever.

Prayers, spells, and intentions using Psalm 93 \rightarrow Back to the index \uparrow

- 1. O Lord God, to whom vengeance belongeth; O God, to whom vengeance belongeth, shew thyself.
- 2. Lift up thyself, thou judge of the earth: render a reward to the proud.
- 3. Lord, how long shall the wicked, how long shall the wicked triumph?
- 4. How long shall they utter and speak hard things? and all the workers of iniquity boast themselves?
- 5. They break in pieces thy people, O Lord, and afflict thine heritage.
- 6. They slay the widow and the stranger, and murder the orphan.
- 7. Yet they say, The Lord shall not see, neither shall the God of Jacob regard it.
- 8. Understand, ye brutish among the people: and ye fools, when will ye be wise?
- 9. They that planted the ear, shall They not hear? They that formed the eye, shall They not see?
- **10.** They that chastiseth the heathen, shall not They correct? Theye that teacheth knowledge, shall not They know?
- 11. The Lord knoweth the thoughts of humanity, that they are vanity.
- 12. Blessed is the person whom thou chastenest, O Lord, and teachest them out of thy law;
- 13. That thou mayest give them rest from the days of adversity, until the pit be digged for the wicked.
- 14. For the Lord will not cast off Their people, neither will They forsake their inheritance.
- 15. But judgment shall return unto righteousness: and all the upright in heart shall follow it.
- 16. Who will rise up for me against the evildoers? or who will stand up for me against the workers of iniquity?
- 17. Unless the Lord had been my help, my soul had almost dwelt in silence.
- 18. When I said, My foot slippeth; thy mercy, O Lord, held me up.
- 19. In the multitude of my thoughts within me thy comforts delight my soul.
- 20. Shall the throne of iniquity have fellowship with thee, which frameth mischief by a law?
- 21. They gather themselves together against the soul of the righteous, and condemn the innocent blood.
- 22. But the Lord is my defence; and my God is the rock of my refuge.
- 23. And They shall bring upon them their own iniquity, and shall cut them off in their own wickedness; yea, the Lord our God shall cut them off.




- 1. O come, let us sing unto the Lord: let us make a joyful noise to the rock of our salvation.

- 11. Unto whom I sware in my wrath that they should not enter into my rest.




- 1. O sing unto the Lord a new song: sing unto the Lord, all the earth.

- 3. Declare Their glory among the heathen, Their wonders among all people.
- 4. For the Lord is great, and greatly to be praised: They are to be feared above all gods.
- 5. For all the gods of the nations are idols: but the Lord made the heavens.
- 6. Honour and majesty are before Them: strength and beauty are in Their sanctuary.
- 7. Give unto the Lord, O ye kindreds of the people, give unto the Lord glory and strength.
- 8. Give unto the Lord the glory due unto Their name: bring an offering, and come into Their courts.
- 9. O worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness: fear before Them, all the earth.

- 11. Let the heavens rejoice, and let the earth be glad; let the sea roar, and the fulness thereof.
- 12. Let the field be joyful, and all that is therein: then shall all the trees of the wood rejoice
- 13. Before the Lord: for They come, for They come to judge the earth: They shall judge the world with righteousness, and the people with Their truth.




- 1. The Lord reigneth; let the earth rejoice; let the multitude of isles be glad thereof.

- **10.** Ye that love the Lord, hate evil: They preserve the souls of Their saints; They deliver them out of the hand of the wicked.
- 11. Light is sown for the righteous, and gladness for the upright in heart.
- 12. Rejoice in the Lord, ye righteous; and give thanks at the remembrance of Their holiness.



- 1. O sing unto the Lord a new song; for They have done marvellous things: Their right hand, and Their holy arm, hath gotten Them the victory.
- 2. The Lord hath made known Their salvation: Their righteousness have They openly shewed in the sight of the heathen.
- 3. They have remembered Their mercy and Their truth toward the house of Israel: all the ends of the earth have seen the salvation of our God.
- 4. Make a joyful noise unto the Lord, all the earth: make a loud noise, and rejoice, and sing praise.
- 5. Sing unto the Lord with the harp; with the harp, and the voice of a psalm.
- 6. With trumpets and sound of cornet make a joyful noise before the Lord, the Queen.
- 7. Let the sea roar, and the fulness thereof; the world, and they that dwell therein.
- 8. Let the floods clap their hands: let the hills be joyful together
- **9.** Before the Lord; for They come to judge the earth: with righteousness shall They judge the world, and the people with equity.




Psalm 99

1. The Lord reigneth; let the people tremble: They sit between the cherubims; let the earth be moved.

- 2. The Lord is great in Zion; and They are high above all the people.
- 3. Let them praise thy great and terrible name; for it is holy.
- 4. The Ruler's strength also loveth judgment; thou dost establish equity, thou executest judgment and righteousness in Jacob.
- 5. Exalt ye the Lord our God, and worship at Their footstool; for They are holy.
- 6. Moses and Aaron among Their priests, and Samuel among them that call upon Their name; they called upon the Lord, and They answered them.
- 7. They spake unto them in the cloudy pillar: they kept Their testimonies, and the ordinance that They gave them.
- 8. Thou answeredst them, O Lord our God: thou wast a God that forgavest them, though thou tookest vengeance of their inventions.
- 9. Exalt the Lord our God, and worship at Their holy hill; for the Lord our God is holy.



- 1. Make a joyful noise unto the Lord, all ye lands.
- 2. Serve the Lord with gladness: come before Their presence with singing.
- 3. Know ye that the Lord They are God: it is Them that hath made us, and not we ourselves; we are Their people, and the sheep of Their pasture.
- 4. Enter into Their gates with thanksgiving, and into Their courts with praise: be thankful unto Them, and bless Their name.
- 5. For the Lord is good; Their mercy is everlasting; and Their truth endureth to all generations.



- 1. I will sing of mercy and judgment: unto thee, O Lord, will I sing.
- 2. I will behave myself wisely in a perfect way. O when wilt thou come unto me? I will walk within my house with a perfect heart.
- 3. I will set no wicked thing before mine eyes: I hate the work of them that turn aside; it shall not cleave to me
- 4. A froward heart shall depart from me: I will not know a wicked person.
- 5. Whoso privily slandereth their neighbour, them will I cut off: them that hath an high look and a proud heart will not I suffer.
- 6. Mine eyes shall be upon the faithful of the land, that they may dwell with me: they that walk in a perfect

way, they shall serve me.

- 7. They that work deceit shall not dwell within my house: they that tell lies shall not tarry in my sight.
- 8. I will early destroy all the wicked of the land; that I may cut off all wicked doers from the city of the Lord.

- 1. Hear my prayer, O Lord, and let my cry come unto thee.
- 2. Hide not thy face from me in the day when I am in trouble; incline thine ear unto me: in the day when I call answer me speedily.
- 3. For my days are consumed like smoke, and my bones are burned as an hearth.
- 4. My heart is smitten, and withered like grass; so that I forget to eat my bread.
- 5. By reason of the voice of my groaning my bones cleave to my skin.
- 6. I am like a pelican of the wilderness: I am like an owl of the desert.
- 7. I watch, and am as a sparrow alone upon the house top.
- 8. Mine enemies reproach me all the day; and they that are mad against me are sworn against me.
- 9. For I have eaten ashes like bread, and mingled my drink with weeping.
- 10. Because of thine indignation and thy wrath: for thou hast lifted me up, and cast me down.
- 11. My days are like a shadow that declineth; and I am withered like grass.
- 12. But thou, O Lord, shall endure for ever; and thy remembrance unto all generations.
- 13. Thou shalt arise, and have mercy upon Zion: for the time to favour it, yea, the set time, is come.
- 14. For thy servants take pleasure in its stones, and favour the dust thereof.
- 15. So the heathen shall fear the name of the Lord, and all the rulers of the earth thy glory.
- 16. When the Lord shall build up Zion, They shall appear in Their glory.
- 17. They will regard the prayer of the destitute, and not despise their prayer.
- This shall be written for the generation to come: and the people which shall be created shall praise the Lord.
- 19. For They have looked down from the height of Their sanctuary; from heaven did the Lord behold the earth:
- 20. To hear the groaning of the prisoner; to loose those that are appointed to death;
- 21. To declare the name of the Lord in Zion, and Their praise in Jerusalem;
- 22. When the people are gathered together, and the kingdoms, to serve the Lord.
- 23. They weakened my strength in the way; They shortened my days.
- 24. I said, O my God, take me not away in the midst of my days: thy years are throughout all generations.
- 25. Of old hast thou laid the foundation of the earth: and the heavens are the work of thy hands.
- **26.** They shall perish, but thou shalt endure: yea, all of them shall wax old like a garment; as a vesture shalt thou change them, and they shall be changed:

- 27. But thou art the same, and thy years shall have no end.
- 28. The children of thy servants shall continue, and their seed shall be established before thee.

- 4. Who redeemeth thy life from destruction; who crowneth thee with lovingkindness and tender mercies;
- 5. Who satisfieth thy mouth with good things; so that thy youth is renewed like the eagle's.
- 6. The Lord executeth righteousness and judgment for all that are oppressed.
- 7. They made known Their ways unto Moses, Their acts unto the children of Israel.
- 8. The Lord is merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and plenteous in mercy.
- 9. They will not always chide: neither will They keep Their anger for ever.
- 10. They have not dealt with us after our sins; nor rewarded us according to our iniquities.
- 11. For as the heaven is high above the earth, so great is Their mercy toward them that fear Them.
- 12. As far as the east is from the west, so far have They removed our transgressions from us.
- 13. Like as a parent pitieth their children, so the Lord pitieth them that fear Them.
- For They know our frame; They remember that we are dust.
- 15. As for humanity, their days are as grass: as a flower of the field, so they flourish.
- 16. For the wind passeth over it, and it is gone; and the place thereof shall know it no more.
- 17. But the mercy of the Lord is from everlasting to everlasting upon them that fear Them, and Their righteousness unto children's children;
- 18. To such as keep Their covenant, and to those that remember Their commandments to do them.
- 19. The Lord hath prepared Their throne in the heavens; and Their dominion ruleth over all.
- 20. Bless the Lord, ye Their angels, that excel in strength, that do Their commandments, hearkening unto the voice of Their word.
- 21. Bless ye the Lord, all ye Their hosts; ye ministers of Them, that do Their pleasure.
- 22. Bless the Lord, all Their works in all places of Their dominion: bless the Lord, O my soul.


- 1. Bless the Lord, O my soul. O Lord my God, thou art very great; thou art clothed with honour and majesty.

- 4. Who maketh Their angels spirits; Their ministers a flaming fire:
- 5. Who laid the foundations of the earth, that it should not be removed for ever.
- 6. Thou coveredst it with the deep as with a garment: the waters stood above the mountains.
- 7. At thy rebuke they fled; at the voice of thy thunder they hasted away.
- 8. They go up by the mountains; they go down by the valleys unto the place which thou hast founded for them.
- 9. Thou hast set a bound that they may not pass over; that they turn not again to cover the earth.
- 10. They send the springs into the valleys, which run among the hills.
- 11. They give drink to every beast of the field: the wild asses quench their thirst.
- 12. By them shall the fowls of the heaven have their habitation, which sing among the branches.
- 13. They water the hills from Their chambers: the earth is satisfied with the fruit of thy works.
- 14. They cause the grass to grow for the cattle, and herb for the service of humanity: that they may bring forth food out of the earth;
- 15. And wine that maketh glad the heart, and oil to make their face to shine, and bread which strengtheneth their heart.
- 16. The trees of the Lord are full of sap; the cedars of Lebanon, which They have planted;
- 17. Where the birds make their nests: as for the stork, the fir trees are its house.
- 18. The high hills are a refuge for the wild goats; and the rocks for the conies.
- 19. They appointed the moon for seasons: the sun knoweth its going down.
- 20. Thou makest darkness, and it is night: wherein all the beasts of the forest do creep forth.
- 21. The young lions roar after their prey, and seek their meat from God.
- 22. The sun ariseth, they gather themselves together, and lay them down in their dens.
- 23. A person goeth forth unto their work and to their labour until the evening.
- 24. O Lord, how manifold are thy works! in wisdom hast thou made them all: the earth is full of thy riches.
- 25. So is this great and wide sea, wherein are things creeping innumerable, both small and great beasts.
- 26. There go the ships: there is that leviathan, whom thou hast made to play therein.
- 27. These wait all upon thee; that thou mayest give them their meat in due season.
- 28. That thou givest them they gather: thou openest thine hand, they are filled with good.
- 29. Thou hidest thy face, they are troubled: thou takest away their breath, they die, and return to their dust.
- **30.** Thou sendest forth thy spirit, they are created: and thou renewest the face of the earth.
- 31. The glory of the Lord shall endure for ever: the Lord shall rejoice in Their works.
- 32. They look on the earth, and it trembleth: They touch the hills, and they smoke.
- 33. I will sing unto the Lord as long as I live: I will sing praise to my God while I have my being.
- 34. My meditation of Them shall be sweet: I will be glad in the Lord.

35. Let the sinners be consumed out of the earth, and let the wicked be no more. Bless thou the Lord, O my soul. Praise ye the Lord.

- 1. O give thanks unto the Lord; call upon Their name: make known Their deeds among the people.
- 2. Sing unto Them, sing psalms unto Them: talk ye of all Their wondrous works.
- 3. Glory ye in Their holy name: let the heart of them rejoice that seek the Lord.
- 4. Seek the Lord, and Her strength: seek Her face evermore.
- 5. Remember Their marvellous works that They have done; Their wonders, and the judgments of Their mouth;
- 6. O ye seed of Abraham Their servant, ye children of Jacob Their chosen.
- 7. They are the Lord our God: Their judgments are in all the earth.
- 8. They have remembered Their covenant for ever, the word which They commanded to a thousand generations.
- 9. Which covenant They made with Abraham, and Their oath unto Isaac;
- 10. And confirmed the same unto Jacob for a law, and to Israel for an everlasting covenant:
- 11. Saying, Unto thee will I give the land of Canaan, the lot of your inheritance:
- 12. When they were but a few people in number; yea, very few, and strangers in it.
- 13. When they went from one nation to another, from one dominion to another people;
- 14. They suffered no one to do them wrong; yea, They reproved rulers for their sakes;
- 15. Saying, Touch not mine anointed, and do my prophets no harm.
- 16. Moreover They called for a famine upon the land: They brake the whole staff of bread.
- 17. They sent a person before them, even Joseph, who was sold for a servant:
- 18. Whose feet they hurt with fetters: they were laid in iron:
- 19. Until the time that Their word came: the word of the Lord tried them.
- 20. The ruler sent and loosed them; even the ruler of the people, and let them go free.
- 21. They made her lord of their house, and ruler of all their substance:
- 22. To bind their nobles at their pleasure; and teach their senators wisdom.
- 23. Israel also came into Egypt; and Jacob sojourned in the land of Ham.
- 24. And They increased Their people greatly; and made them stronger than their enemies.
- 25. They turned their heart to hate Their people, to deal subtilly with Her servants.
- **26.** They sent Moses Their servant; and Aaron whom They had chosen.
- 27. They shewed Their signs among them, and wonders in the land of Ham.
- 28. They sent darkness, and made it dark; and they rebelled not against Their word.

- 29. They turned their waters into blood, and slew their fish.
- 30. Their land brought forth frogs in abundance, in the chambers of their rulers.
- 31. They spake, and there came divers sorts of flies, and lice in all their coasts.
- 32. They gave them hail for rain, and flaming fire in their land.
- 33. They smote their vines also and their fig trees; and brake the trees of their coasts.
- 34. They spake, and the locusts came, and caterpillers, and that without number,
- **35.** And did eat up all the herbs in their land, and devoured the fruit of their ground.
- 36. They smote also all the firstborn in their land, the chief of all their strength.
- 37. They brought them forth also with silver and gold: and there was not one feeble person among their tribes.
- 38. Egypt was glad when they departed: for the fear of them fell upon them.
- **39.** They spread a cloud for a covering; and fire to give light in the night.
- 40. The people asked, and They brought quails, and satisfied them with the bread of heaven.
- 41. They opened the rock, and the waters gushed out; they ran in the dry places like a river.
- 42. For They remembered Their holy promise, and Abraham Their servant.
- 43. And They brought forth Their people with joy, and Their chosen with gladness:
- 44. And gave them the lands of the heathen: and they inherited the labour of the people;
- 45. That they might observe Their statutes, and keep Their laws. Praise ye the Lord.



- 1. Praise ye the Lord. O give thanks unto the Lord; for They are good: for Their mercy endureth for ever.
- 2. Who can utter the mighty acts of the Lord? who can shew forth all Their praise?
- 3. Blessed are they that keep judgment, and they that do righteousness at all times.
- 4. Remember me, O Lord, with the favour that thou bearest unto thy people: O visit me with thy salvation;
- 5. That I may see the good of thy chosen, that I may rejoice in the gladness of thy nation, that I may glory with thine inheritance.
- 6. We have sinned with our ancestors, we have committed iniquity, we have done wickedly.
- 7. Our ancestors understood not thy wonders in Egypt; they remembered not the multitude of thy mercies; but provoked Them at the sea, even at the Red sea.
- 8. Nevertheless They saved them for Their name's sake, that They might make Their mighty power to be known.
- 9. They rebuked the Red sea also, and it was dried up: so They led them through the depths, as through the wilderness.
- **10.** And They saved them from the hand of those that hated them, and redeemed them from the hand of the enemy.

- 11. And the waters covered their enemies: there was not one of them left.
- 12. Then believed they Their words; they sang Their praise.
- 13. They soon forgat Their works; they waited not for Their counsel:
- 14. But lusted exceedingly in the wilderness, and tempted God in the desert.
- 15. And They gave them their request; but sent leanness into their soul.
- 16. They envied Moses also in the camp, and Aaron the saint of the Lord.
- 17. The earth opened and swallowed up Dathan and covered the company of Abiram.
- 18. And a fire was kindled in their company; the flame burned up the wicked.
- 19. They made a calf in Horeb, and worshipped the molten image.
- 20. Thus they changed their glory into the similitude of an ox that eateth grass.
- 21. They forgat God their saviour, which had done great things in Egypt;
- 22. Wondrous works in the land of Ham, and terrible things by the Red sea.
- 23. Therefore They said that They would destroy them, had not Moses Their chosen stood before Them in the breach, to turn away Their wrath, lest They should destroy them.
- 24. Yea, they despised the pleasant land, they believed not Their word:
- 25. But murmured in their tents, and hearkened not unto the voice of the Lord.
- 26. Therefore They lifted up Their hand against them, to overthrow them in the wilderness:
- 27. To overthrow their seed also among the nations, and to scatter them in the lands.
- 28. They joined themselves also unto Baalpeor, and ate the sacrifices of the dead.
- 29. Thus they provoked Them to anger with their inventions: and the plague brake in upon them.
- 30. Then stood up Phinehas, and executed judgment: and so the plague was stayed.
- 31. And that was counted unto Them for righteousness unto all generations for evermore.
- 32. They angered Them also at the waters of strife, so that it went ill with the prophet for their sakes:
- 33. Because they provoked their spirit, so that they spake unadvisedly with their lips.
- 34. They did not destroy the nations, concerning whom the Lord commanded them:
- 35. But were mingled among the heathen, and learned their works.
- 36. And they served their idols: which were a snare unto them.
- 37. Yea, they sacrificed their children unto devils,
- **38.** And shed innocent blood, even the blood of their children, whom they sacrificed unto the idols of Canaan: and the land was polluted with blood.
- 39. Thus were they defiled with their own works, and went a whoring with their own inventions.
- **40.** Therefore was the wrath of the Lord kindled against Their people, insomuch that They abhorred Their own inheritance.
- 41. And They gave them into the hand of the heathen; and they that hated them ruled over them.
- 42. Their enemies also oppressed them, and they were brought into subjection under their hand.
- **43.** Many times did They deliver them; but they provoked Them with their counsel, and were brought low for their iniquity.
- 44. Nevertheless They regarded their affliction, when They heard their cry:
- **45.** And They remembered for them Their covenant, and repented according to the multitude of Their mercies.

- 46. They made them also to be pitied of all those that carried them captives.
- **47.** Save us, O Lord our God, and gather us from among the heathen, to give thanks unto thy holy name, and to triumph in thy praise.
- **48.** Blessed be the Lord God of Israel from everlasting to everlasting: and let all the people say, Amen. Praise ye the Lord.



- 1. O give thanks unto the Lord, for They are good: for Their mercy endureth for ever.
- 2. Let the redeemed of the Lord say so, whom They have redeemed from the hand of the enemy;
- 3. And gathered them out of the lands, from the east, and from the west, from the north, and from the south.
- 4. They wandered in the wilderness in a solitary way; they found no city to dwell in.
- 5. Hungry and thirsty, their soul fainted in them.
- 6. Then they cried unto the Lord in their trouble, and They delivered them out of their distresses.
- 7. And They led them forth by the right way, that they might go to a city of habitation.
- 8. Oh that people would praise the Lord for Their goodness, and for Their wonderful works to the children of humanity!
- 9. For They satisfy the longing soul, and fill the hungry soul with goodness.
- 10. Such as sit in darkness and in the shadow of death, being bound in affliction and iron;
- 11. Because they rebelled against the words of God, and contemned the counsel of the most High:
- 12. Therefore They brought down their heart with labour; they fell down, and there was none to help.
- 13. Then they cried unto the Lord in their trouble, and They saved them out of their distresses.
- 14. They brought them out of darkness and the shadow of death, and brake their bands in sunder.
- 15. Oh that people would praise the Lord for Their goodness, and for Their wonderful works to the children of humanity!
- 16. For They have broken the gates of brass, and cut the bars of iron in sunder.
- 17. Fools because of their transgression, and because of their iniquities, are afflicted.
- 18. Their soul abhorreth all manner of meat; and they draw near unto the gates of death.
- 19. Then they cry unto the Lord in their trouble, and They save them out of their distresses.
- 20. They sent Their word, and healed them, and delivered them from their destructions.
- 21. Oh that people would praise the Lord for Their goodness, and for Their wonderful works to the children of humanity!
- 22. And let them sacrifice the sacrifices of thanksgiving, and declare Their works with rejoicing.
- 23. They that go down to the sea in ships, that do business in great waters;
- 24. These see the works of the Lord, and Their wonders in the deep.
- 25. For They command, and raise the stormy wind, which lifteth up the waves thereof.

- 26. They mount up to the heaven, they go down again to the depths: their soul is melted because of trouble.
- 27. They reel to and fro, and stagger like a drunkard, and are at their wit's end.
- 28. Then they cry unto the Lord in their trouble, and They bring them out of their distresses.
- 29. They make the storm a calm, so that the waves thereof are still.
- 30. Then are they glad because they be quiet; so They bring them unto their desired haven.
- 31. Oh that people would praise the Lord for Their goodness, and for Their wonderful works to the children of humanity!
- **32.** Let them exalt Them also in the congregation of the people, and praise Them in the assembly of the elders.
- 33. They turn rivers into a wilderness, and the watersprings into dry ground;
- 34. A fruitful land into barrenness, for the wickedness of them that dwell therein.
- 35. They turn the wilderness into a standing water, and dry ground into watersprings.
- **36.** And there They make the hungry to dwell, that they may prepare a city for habitation;
- 37. And sow the fields, and plant vineyards, which may yield fruits of increase.
- 38. They bless them also, so that they are multiplied greatly; and suffer not their cattle to decrease.
- 39. Again, they are minished and brought low through oppression, affliction, and sorrow.
- **40.** They pour contempt upon nobles, and cause them to wander in the wilderness, where there is no way.
- 41. Yet set They the poor on high from affliction, and make their families like a flock.
- 42. The righteous shall see it, and rejoice: and all iniquity shall stop its mouth.
- 43. Whoso is wise, and will observe these things, even they shall understand the lovingkindness of the Lord.



- O God, my heart is fixed; I will sing and give praise, even with my glory.
- 2. Awake, psaltery and harp: I myself will awake early.
- 3. I will praise thee, O Lord, among the people: and I will sing praises unto thee among the nations.
- 4. For thy mercy is great above the heavens: and thy truth reacheth unto the clouds.
- 5. Be thou exalted, O God, above the heavens: and thy glory above all the earth;
- 6. That thy beloved may be delivered: save with thy right hand, and answer me.
- 7. God hath spoken in Their holiness; I will rejoice, I will divide Shechem, and mete out the valley of Succoth.
- 8. Gilead is mine; Manasseh is mine; Ephraim also is the strength of mine head; Judah is my lawgiver;
- 9. Moab is my washpot; over Edom will I cast out my shoe; over Philistia will I triumph.
- 10. Who will bring me into the strong city? who will lead me into Edom?
- 11. Wilt not thou, O God, who hast cast us off? and wilt not thou, O God, go forth with our hosts?

- 12. Give us help from trouble: for vain is the help of mortals.
- 13. Through God we shall do valiantly: for God it is that shall tread down our enemies.


- 1. Hold not thy peace, O God of my praise;
- 2. For the mouth of the wicked and the mouth of the deceitful are opened against me: they have spoken against me with a lying tongue.
- They compassed me about also with words of hatred; and fought against me without a cause.
- 4. For my love they are my adversaries: but I give myself unto prayer.
- 5. And they have rewarded me evil for good, and hatred for my love.
- 6. Set thou a wicked enemy over them: and let Satan stand at their right hand.
- 7. When they shall be judged, let them be condemned: and let their prayer become sin.
- 8. Let their days be few; and let another take their office.
- 9. Let their children be orphans, and their spouse a widow.
- **10.** Let their children be continually vagabonds, and beg: let them seek their bread also out of their desolate places.
- 11. Let the extortioner catch all that they have; and let the strangers spoil their labour.
- 12. Let there be none to extend mercy unto them: neither let there be any to favour their orphaned children.
- 13. Let their posterity be cut off; and in the generation following let their name be blotted out.
- 14. Let the iniquity of their ancestors be remembered with the Lord; and let not the sin of their parents be blotted out.
- 15. Let them be before the Lord continually, that They may cut off the memory of them from the earth.
- **16.** Because that they remembered not to shew mercy, but persecuted the poor and needy, that they might even slay the broken in heart.
- 17. As they loved cursing, so let it come unto them: as they delighted not in blessing, so let it be far from them.
- **18.** As they clothed themselves with cursing like as with their garment, so let it come into their bowels like water, and like oil into their bones.
- 19. Let it be unto them as the garment which covereth them, and for a girdle wherewith they are girdle continually.
- 20. Let this be the reward of mine adversaries from the Lord, and of them that speak evil against my soul.
- 21. But do thou for me, O God the Lord, for thy name's sake: because thy mercy is good, deliver thou me.
- 22. For I am poor and needy, and my heart is wounded within me.
- 23. I am gone like the shadow when it declineth: I am tossed up and down as the locust.
- 24. My knees are weak through fasting; and my flesh faileth of fatness.
- 25. I became also a reproach unto them: when they looked upon me they shaked their heads.

- **26.** Help me, O Lord my God: O save me according to thy mercy:
- 27. That they may know that this is thy hand; that thou, Lord, hast done it.
- 28. Let them curse, but bless thou: when they arise, let them be ashamed; but let thy servant rejoice.
- 29. Let mine adversaries be clothed with shame, and let them cover themselves with their own confusion, as with a mantle.
- **30.** I will greatly praise the Lord with my mouth; yea, I will praise Them among the multitude.
- 31. For They shall stand at the right hand of the poor, to save them from those that condemn their soul.


Psalm 114

- 8. Which turned the rock into a standing water, the flint into a fountain of waters.




- 1. Not unto us, O Lord, not unto us, but unto thy name give glory, for thy mercy, and for thy truth's sake.




- 1. Unto thee lift I up mine eyes, O thou that dwellest in the heavens.

- 8. Our help is in the name of the Lord, who made heaven and earth.




- 1. They that trust in the Lord shall be as mount Zion, which cannot be removed, but abideth for ever.


Psalm 126

Psalm 127


- 1. Except the Lord build the house, they labour in vain that build it: except the Lord keep the city, the guard waketh but in vain.

- 3. Thy beloved shall be as a fruitful vine by the sides of thine house: thy children like olive plants round


about thy table.


Psalm 132



- 12. And gave their land for an heritage, an heritage unto Israel Their people.


- 13. Thy name, O Lord, endureth for ever; and thy memorial, O Lord, throughout all generations.

- 7. Whither shall I go from thy spirit? or whither shall I flee from thy presence?
- 8. If I ascend up into heaven, thou art there: if I make my bed in hell, behold, thou art there.
- 9. If I take the wings of the morning, and dwell in the uttermost parts of the sea;
- 10. Even there shall thy hand lead me, and thy right hand shall hold me.
- 11. If I say, Surely the darkness shall cover me; even the night shall be light about me.
- 12. Yea, the darkness hideth not from thee; but the night shineth as the day: the darkness and the light are both alike to thee.
- 13. For thou hast possessed my reins: thou hast covered me in my mother's womb.
- 14. I will praise thee; for I am fearfully and wonderfully made: marvellous are thy works; and that my soul knoweth right well.
- **15.** My substance was not hid from thee, when I was made in secret, and curiously wrought in the lowest parts of the earth.
- **16.** Thine eyes did see my substance, yet being unperfect; and in thy book all my members were written, which in continuance were fashioned, when as yet there was none of them.
- 17. How precious also are thy thoughts unto me, O God! how great is the sum of them!

- 2. Let my prayer be set forth before thee as incense; and the lifting up of my hands as the evening sacrifice.
- 3. Set a watch, O Lord, before my mouth; keep the door of my lips.
- 4. Incline not my heart to any evil thing, to practise wicked works with those that work iniquity: and let me not eat of their dainties.
- 5. Let the righteous smite me; it shall be a kindness: and let them reprove me; it shall be an excellent oil, which shall not break my head: for yet my prayer also shall be in their calamities.

- 8. But mine eyes are unto thee, O God the Lord: in thee is my trust; leave not my soul destitute.
- 9. Keep me from the snares which they have laid for me, and the gins of the workers of iniquity.
- 10. Let the wicked fall into their own nets, whilst that I withal escape.

- 1. Hear my prayer, O Lord, give ear to my supplications: in thy faithfulness answer me, and in thy righteousness.
- 2. And enter not into judgment with thy servant: for in thy sight shall no one living be justified.
- 3. For the enemy hath persecuted my soul; they have smitten my life down to the ground; they have made me to dwell in darkness, as those that have been long dead.
- 4. Therefore is my spirit overwhelmed within me; my heart within me is desolate.
- 5. I remember the days of old; I meditate on all thy works; I muse on the work of thy hands.
- 6. I stretch forth my hands unto thee: my soul thirsteth after thee, as a thirsty land. Selah.
- 7. Hear me speedily, O Lord: my spirit faileth: hide not thy face from me, lest I be like unto them that go down into the pit.
- 8. Cause me to hear thy lovingkindness in the morning; for in thee do I trust: cause me to know the way wherein I should walk; for I lift up my soul unto thee.
- 9. Deliver me, O Lord, from mine enemies: I flee unto thee to hide me.
- **10.** Teach me to do thy will; for thou art my God: thy spirit is good; lead me into the land of uprightness.
- 11. Quicken me, O Lord, for thy name's sake: for thy righteousness' sake bring my soul out of trouble.
- 12. And of thy mercy cut off mine enemies, and destroy all them that afflict my soul: for I am thy servant.

Prayers, spells, and intentions using Psalm 143→




- 1. Blessed be the Lord my strength which teacheth my hands to war, and my fingers to fight:

- 14. That our oxen may be strong to labour; that there be no breaking in, nor going out; that there be no complaining in our streets.

- 5. I will speak of the glorious honour of thy majesty, and of thy wondrous works.


- 6. And Thy people shall speak of the might of thy terrible acts: and I will declare thy greatness.

- 10. The Lord shall reign for ever, even thy God, O Zion, unto all generations. Praise ye the Lord.


<u>Prayers, spells, and intentions using Psalm 146</u> \rightarrow <u>Back to the index</u> \uparrow

- 14. They make peace in thy borders, and fill thee with the finest of the wheat.
- 15. They send forth Their commandment upon earth: Their word runneth very swiftly.
- 16. They give snow like wool: They scatter the hoarfrost like ashes.
- 17. They cast forth their ice like morsels: who can stand before Their cold?
- 18. They send out Their word, and melt them: They cause Their wind to blow, and the waters flow.
- 19. They shew Their word unto Jacob, Their statutes and Their judgments unto Israel.
- 20. They have not dealt so with any nation: and as for Their judgments, they have not known them. Praise ye the Lord.




- 1. Praise ye the Lord. Praise ye the Lord from the heavens: praise Them in the heights.
- 2. Praise ye Them, all Their angels: praise ye Them, all Their hosts.
- 3. Praise ye Them, sun and moon: praise Them, all ye stars of light.
- 4. Praise Them, ye heavens of heavens, and ye waters that be above the heavens.
- 5. Let them praise the name of the Lord: for They commanded, and they were created.
- 6. They have also established them for ever and ever: They have made a decree which shall not pass.

- 7. Praise the Lord from the earth, ye dragons, and all deeps:
- 8. Fire, and hail; snow, and vapours; stormy wind fulfilling Their word:
- 9. Mountains, and all hills; fruitful trees, and all cedars:
- 10. Beasts, and all cattle; creeping things, and flying fowl:
- 11. Rulers of the earth, and all people; nobles, and all judges of the earth:
- 12. Young people, old people, and children:
- 13. Let them praise the name of the Lord: for Their name alone is excellent; Their glory is above the earth and heaven.
- 14. They also exalt the horn of Their people, the praise of all Their saints; even of the children of Israel, a people near unto Them. Praise ye the Lord.



- 1. Praise ye the Lord. Sing unto the Lord a new song, and Their praise in the congregation of saints.
- 2. Let Israel rejoice in Them that made them: let the children of Zion be joyful in their Ruler.
- 3. Let them praise Their name in the dance: let them sing praises unto Them with the timbrel and harp.
- 4. For the Lord taketh pleasure in Their people: They will beautify the meek with salvation.
- 5. Let the saints be joyful in glory: let them sing aloud upon their beds.
- 6. Let the high praises of God be in their mouth, and a two-edged sword in their hand;
- 7. To execute vengeance upon the heathen, and punishments upon the people;
- 8. To bind their rulers with chains, and their nobles with fetters of iron;
- 9. To execute upon them the judgment written: this honour have all Their saints. Praise ye the Lord.



- 1. Praise ye the Lord. Praise God in Their sanctuary: praise Them in the firmament of their power.
- 2. Praise Them for their mighty acts: praise Them according to their excellent greatness.
- 3. Praise Them with the sound of the trumpet: praise Them with the psaltery and harp.
- 4. Praise Them with the timbrel and dance: praise Them with stringed instruments and organs.
- 5. Praise Them upon the loud cymbals: praise Them upon the high sounding cymbals.
- 6. Let every thing that hath breath praise the Lord. Praise ye the Lord.
